### WHAT IS VALENTINE'S DAY?

Valentine's Day (or Saint Valentine's Day) is observed on February 14<sup>th</sup> each year. Today Valentine's Day is celebrated in many countries around the world, mostly in the West, although it remains a working day in all of them. The original "St. Valentine" was just a liturgical celebration of one or more early Christian saints named Valentinus. All the modern romantic connotations were added several centuries later by poets.

The day first became associated with romantic love in the circle of Geoffrey Chaucer in the High Middle Ages, when

the tradition of courtly love flourished. By the 15th century, it had evolved into an occasion in which lovers expressed their love for each other by presenting flowers, offering confectionery and sending greeting cards (known as "valentines").

Modern Valentine's Day symbols include the heart-shaped outline, doves, and the figure of the winged Cupid. Since the 19th century, handwritten valentines have given way to mass-produced greeting cards.



Nablac Downpour at Tipperary: On Friday of last week Messrs Walter Murray, Guy Singleton and two members of the Trotter family took a motor trip to Tipperary to inspect Mr Jock Affleck's pure bred Jersey herd. They were greatly impressed with the cattle particularly the female stock. The hill on the property is about 1,300 feet above sea level and the visitors had a splendid view from this upland being able to see the seven mile beach and other beaches around the Forster district. Ominous rain clouds hurried the departure of the visitors, but they had not gone far before the deluge came and in a few minutes the road was so covered with water that the car swung around one and a half times before stopping. The rain fell for about half an hour and greatly refreshed the pastures. Two miles away the road was dry as bone dust. People lower down the creek could not understand what made the rise in the water. This water runs into Firefly Creek.

We are informed there is an abundance of good feed and water all over Tipperary at the present time and the cows are milking splendidly.

<u>FIRE AT NABIAC - MAY 1932</u>: On Wednesday morning at 3 o'clock a fire in a six room weatherboard cottage near the Nabiac School, owned by Mrs *C. Dodd*, was totally destroyed by fire. The house was untenanted but was being prepared for the family to reside in in order that the children could attend school. The origin of the fire is unknown. An enquiry is to be held by Mr *H. Flett*, the Coroner, today, Saturday.

Reports were presented by the President and Treasurer as well as by sub committees the Op Shop, CTC, Aub Ferris Sports Field Redevelopment and Nabiac Landcare. Some minor changes of the Association's Constitution (to correct some discrepancies) were considered and approved by the meeting.


Positions were then vacated and with Philip Costa in the Chair as Returning Officer, elections held for the 2019 Committee. The new Committee is President - Kit Carson, Vice President - Colin Henderson, Secretary and Public Officer - Louise Collins, Treasurer - Ross Dearing with Committee members being Hannah Lindbeck, Grahame Lindbeck, John Baker, Carol Grace and Ann Newlan.

At a General Meeting which followed, a budget was approved for the supply and installation of infra red security cameras at the pool. We were hopeful of them being installed prior to the start of school holidays in December but are still waiting on final sign off from Mid Coast Council. We are now hopeful of them being installed in February.

Our application for a NSW Government grant of \$10,000 to assist complete the BBQ and picnic area at the children's playground was partly successful. \$5,000 was approved and a cheque for this amount has been presented to the Committee by Stephen Bromhead. remaining costs will be met by MidCoast Council and the Op Shop. Work is expected to be completed later in 2019.

### **BBO** and Picnic Area

Last year we applied for funding to build a BBQ and picnic area close to the children's play area. This plan involves a double electric BBQ with a roof and a large picnic table with seating and a roof. This replaces the BBQ that was removed





Minimbah Rural Fire Brigade wishes you all a Happy and Healthy New Year - stress free would be great, but because we're not greedy, we will settle for Happy and Healthy.



We were delighted with the turnout at our Community Christmas Party when we met and welcomed more newcomers to the area. It is so encouraging to meet residents who have recently made the move to Minimbah and who are keen to find out about our Brigade, our neighbourhood and what they should be doing to prevent, or at least minimize damage to their property in the event of a bushfire.

At the request of one couple we took the opportunity to use our January training day to carry out an inspection of their secluded property and offer some low cost and very doable ideas that could reduce the danger of ember attack on their home. We did make some suggestions with some minor changes to their water supply which may come in handy if a fire was to break out. All part of the service. It's far more pleasant to make these visits when things are calm and smoke free, rather than with lights and sirens blaring as a response to a Triple Zero call. The return trip to the Fire Station was via several fire trails and private roads that we are now more familiar with. Not quite bush bashing – just exploring and familiarizing.

We are not Boy Scouts, but we still promote the motto "Be Prepared".

You can imagine that it would be a trifle difficult to get fire insurance when the fire is coming up your driveway. Similarly, it is very unwise to have to make a potentially lifesaving decision, in the middle of a crisis, without any previous thought. A Bushfire can be a crisis, depending on the severity, the location and many other things. Panic, Panic! Do we leave or do we stay? Do we evacuate to the chook house, set the horse free and then jump in the dam, and the list goes

So, what do you need? ... A Fireproof Plan. need it? ... NOW.

Well if the power goes off then many of us have no house phones, no water pumps, no news updates if relying on TV or electric radios, and you can't recharge the mobile phone. ### BLUE BLOCKING GLASSES: MISCONCEPTION

It is a misconception that blue-light-blocking glasses help reduce eye strain when you spend all day looking at computer, smartphone screens, or other



# FEATURE WEED - COCKSPUR CORAL TREE

Weed officers are targeting this spiny feral ornamental tree, which can become a major weed of waterways and other moist environments. Look out for its pretty red flowers, which are out now and will finish in early autumn. A deciduous tree, it is bare and less obvious in winter.

Established trees can be difficult to get rid of, and they can re-establish from small amounts of rootstock, or branch fragments in ground contact. Weed workers have been successfully experimenting with a basal bark herbicide technique.


# REAL KULTCHA

# Permaculture in the Garden

Permaculture. Maybe you've heard the word mentioned somewhere, maybe you know someone that is involved in permaculture. Maybe you're already practicing aspects encompassed by permaculture and don't even know it. Many people are. But what is it actually?

The term comes from the words Permananent & Agriculture and was coined by its' founders Bill Mollison & his student, David Holmgren, in the 1970s. Bill Mollison perhaps described it best in his book 'Permaculture: A designers Manual' as being "The conscious design & maintenance of agriculturally productive systems which have the diversity, stability & resilience of natural ecosystems. It is the harmonious integration of the landscape with people providing food, energy, shelter & other material & non-material needs in a sustainable way".

At the very heart of Permaculture lies three ethics that anyone involved in the practice will strive to embrace at all times and reflect in all decisions.

Earth Care People Care Fair Share

These three ethics along with 12 principles are the guides which we use to help us turn this concept into action. The 12 principles are notions such as *Use small and slow solutions*, *Use & Value Diversity*, *Catch & Store Energy*, *Use and Value Renewable Resources & Services'* & *Integrate rather than Segregate*. By applying these principles we can find creative solutions to energy, waste management, building, water, animal systems, forestry, food production, economics, community development and any other challenge we are facing today or will face in the future. Permaculture encourages creativity and applied solutions for each particular situation and is a mixture of new and old technologies. It incorporates systems that have been used for thousands of years such as terracing to slow water down in hilly land-scapes, companion planting or composting, whilst also embracing new technologies such as solar.

It recognises that there is a lot we can learn from nature – she knows what she's doing - and if we take the time to observe and interact accordingly, we can create "Consciously designed landscapes which mimic the patterns and relationships found in nature, while yielding an abundance of food, fibre and energy for provision of local needs" Holmgren (2002). Holmgren will also tell us that Permaculture is not

This is all completely possible through concepts such as permaculture (among others). # HUNTER FARMERS LOOKOUT FOR LOCUSTS

Hunter Local Land Services is reminding landholders to look closely at any grasshop-

pers on their properties, following confirmation of Australian plague locust populations on six properties in the Upper Hunter.

There are numerous types of locusts and grasshoppers common at this time of year, many of which regularly occur in our region, but farmers are advised to be aware of plague locust populations.

Hunter Local Land Services Biosecurity Team Leader Luke Booth said if farmers suspect they have Australian plague locusts on farm, they should report it to Local Land Services immediately.

"These locusts are uncommon in our region, and there has not been a known outbreak in more than a decade, and with farmers trying to sustain pastures for livestock during the drought, we want to keep it that way," Luke said.

The identified locusts are considered to be in poor condition due to the ongoing hot dry conditions and lack of available feed, which is hoped will lead to a high mortality rate.

However landholders are being urged to watch for any swarms, to ensure control measures can be implemented quickly before second generation hatchings can begin.

"We are encouraging any landholders who suspect they may have the locusts on their property to join with us in identifying this pest to enable proactive control programs," said Luke.

"We are working with the Department of Primary Industries and affected landholders to develop effective control programs for the identified populations around the Upper Hunter."

Adults of the Australian plague locust can be readily distinguished from other species by the large dark spot on the tip of the hindwings and distinctive scarlet hindleg shanks. Adult body colour is variable and can be grey, brown or green. Adult males measure 25-30 mm long while females are 30-42 mm long.

### **Across Aromatherapy**

I haven't written anything for Across the Fence for some time, so I thought that I would go back to basics for this article. People often think that aromatherapy oils are just "nice perfumes". Not so! Aromatherapy

(or essential) oils are therapeutic, that is they have an effect on the physical body as well as the emotions. Some are very powerful ant-bacterial, anti-fungal or anti-viral agents, some (such as frankincense) are antidepressants, while others are analgesic (wintergreen can relieve the pain of arthritis or a sprain). I find that essential oils are particularly good for stress. I liken them to herbal medicines, where part of the whole plant is used to make a medicine, in aromatherapy, the oil is removed from the plant with all it's therapeutic properties.


Always use good quality essential oils, they will be labelled "therapeutic". There are many things that unscrupulous companies can do to cut costs, such as by adding synthetic compounds or by reducing the time while increasing the temperature during the process of obtaining the oil from the plant. By adulterating the oil it loses some of its therapeutic effect.

Keep your essential oils in a cool dark place, they are expensive so worth looking after. Always store them in glass, over time plastic will absorb the essential oil. And remember, like ordinary kitchen oils, they can go rancid over time if not stored properly.

Lavender is a good essential to have on stand-by — excellent to put neat on wound to promote healing and prevent infection, it can also be used to treat burns as it promotes tissue regeneration and it has a calming effect so is good in a diffuser or oil burner. I like to tell the story of my horse, Rosie, who was pregnant and not happy about it as she had lost her best friend in a foaling disaster. Then she scraped her nose down to the bone. I had just started my journey into aromatherapy so decided to trial lavender morning and evening. After 2 or 3 days the wound started to close in, everyday a little bit more. Amazingly her anxiety reduced and her behaviour and attitude to her pregnancy changed. Her nose healed over - no infection and no scar, and she subsequently had a lovely little colt. She still loves the smell of lavender!

c. Practise asking yourself questions like Are there other ways to look at this? What would I advise a friend in similar situation?

d. The big picture ...

- What is the worst that could happen?
  - If the worst happens, can I survive it?
  - Will this matter tomorrow or next week?
    - e. Practise making mistakes ...
      - eg. in an email
  - Leave part of the house messy get the children to help - Admit when you feel tired or other 'weak' feelings.
