#### **Nabiac Landcare**

Rain, lovely rain! Weeds, glorious weeds! It's becoming beautifully green in our part of the coast but dig down under the mulch on the forest floor and the dirt is still quite dry.

The obvious weed of the moment is the yellow flowering cassia (Senna). If you're a gardener it's a bit of a shock to see it poking it's bright colour out of a carefully weeded shrub or hedge. Senna is considered an environmental weed. It's probably a garden escapee. In the past twenty years it has spread through much of the area along roads and in the bush. It has tough bean like seeds that are spread by birds and moving water. The seeds can remain dormant in the soil for up to five years and possibly longer. If you want to keep the plant in your garden, please prune off the green seed pods. Smaller plants pull easily. If using herbicide follow the label. If cutting and painting cut as low as possible and paint quickly.

Now is a good time to walk through your patch of bush and play 'spot the cassia'. Remember to check for babies around larger plants and plan a follow up if you discover a large flowering cassia.

There is one local native species (Senna acclinis) but it is mainly in coastal rainforest and fairly rare. If you live along the coast and are unsure 'Google it' or contact your local weed inspector.

Nabiac Landcare work each Wednesday (weather permitting) 8-9am to 11am, followed by morning tea at the picnic tables at Bullock Wharf. Membership is only \$2.00 plus an occasional donation to the morning tea fund and new members are always welcome. Tools and safety gear supplied. Give us a ring if you are interested.


#### **ANZAC DAY MARCH AT KRAMBACH**

**Local History - The Wallamba** - Another in a series of historical articles gleaned from the archives of the "Manning River Times" 1932 by Bob Mann

**KRAMBACH - AUGUST 1932**: The weather is growing nice and warm and all the farmers are busy preparing the land for maize crops. Some of the winter crops are looking very good in this district and hopes are held out for greater results at a later period.

Mr *George Easton*, of this locality, is a patient in the Mayo Hospital at present. Later reports say that he is better than he was a little time ago. We wish him a speedy and complete recovery.

A demonstration in the destruction of rabbits was given recently by Mr W.S. Andrews on the property of Mr George Paterson with a good party of interested men on the land paying close attention to the work.

There was a large attendance at the annual meeting of the Krambach branch of the Agricultural Bureau held in the local School of Arts. Officers Elected:- President - Mr *Tom Gallagher* (Jnr.), Vice President - Mr *Edwin Wright*, Secretary and Treasure - Mr *Jas. Kellaher*.

A sample of the winter fodder trials that are being carried out here on the property of Mrs *P.B. Martin*, Orange Hill, and worked by Mr *Vic Martin*, was on show at the meeting and the eyes of the farmers feasted in plenty on this wonderful sample.

A great discussion took place on the rabbit and after listening to the very fine address given by Mr W.S. Andrews we feel sure the pest shall now have to clear to other parts to miss clashing with the farmers army which has declared war on the bunny. Mr Andrews offered a prize for the best essay on the destruction of rabbits to the members of this branch of the Bureau.

Dairying is now at a very low level in our district. The supply has not been as low for years and the price is keeping with the supply, but as is customary of the farmer he is hoping for the creation of records during the spring and summer months so as to balance the low prices he has received for his product.

KARKATT - AUGUST, 1932: A meeting was held by the Manning Shire Council in the Karkatt School of Arts last week on Monday night and was well attended by local residents who are keenly interested in further work being carried out on the Bucca Wauka - Tipperary Roads. Mr C.H. Milligan, president of the Manning Shire Council, was present and after apologizing for the absence of Crs. Breckenridge and Martin, who were unable to attend, explained the object of the meeting. He said that it was proposed to hold similar meetings in various parts of the shire in order to have petitions drawn up and forwarded to Sydney to procure some of the local relief money for expenditure on the necessary road work. He explained the efforts which the shire had made in the past to secure more money but the inevitable reply was no money available for the roads. He thought the idea of a petition would perhaps be more successful. Referring to the



Tipperary Road he suggested that the residents prepare a petition asking for a bridge in preference to a deviation as the cost would be much less and therefore the chances of securing a grant would be proportionably greater. It was finally resolved to prepare petitions as suggested and forward them to the Shire Council.

KRAMBACH - SEPTEMBER, 1932: At the home of Mr & Mrs George Easton, of Browns Creek, there was a big gathering of relatives and friends to celebrate the birthdays of both Mr George Easton and hi son Jim, as they both had the same anniversary. The "Gloom Chasers" supplied the music for the young folk to enjoy themselves at dancing, and this was done in right royal fashion. During the evening Mr George Easton presented Jim with his own watch and chain which he was presented with 49 years ago by his own father, the late Robert Easton, of Dry Creek, Krambach, for his 21st birthday. This was a generous presentation from father to son and an historic one for the present recipient of the heirloom. We hope to see restored to his former good health and live long to enjoy it.

The spring sale day is the day of the year for the cattle men of our district and many were the pioneers who come out to see their stock sold and others to see their old friends. Notably among these were Messrs Arthur and George Holstein, Robert and George Easton, Thos. and George Murray, Frank Schneider, Henry Paterson, Thos. Paff and many others too numerous to mention. As is the usual practice, most of the pick of our classy beef were sold to buyers from the Dungog district. Mr Donald Paterson was a very busy man selling over 1,000 head in the afternoon. Most of these were of a good quality class, yet when one compares the yarding with other yards it can readily be seen what the swingover to the dairy stock is doing in cattle breeding here.

<u>Tennis</u>: Our local tennis club played off their tournament on Sunday last when Misses *Livermore* and *Berriman* won the doubles prizes and Messers *Holstein* and *Abrahams* were the successful gents. Mr Holstein was one of the previous winners here.

The annual School of Arts ball was held on the 7<sup>th</sup> inst. the attendance being very satisfactory and a good pleasurable evening was the result. The "Gloom Chasers" supplied the music and Mr *J.E. Gallagher* was M.C. who kept all hands busy, both players and dancers.

Mr Edwin Wright, of Avalon, had the misfortune to have his barn and contents totally destroyed by fire last Sunday night, and has suffered a big loss as a consequence. We all offer him our sympathy in his loss which would take him hundreds of pounds to replace as it was uninsured.

#### **MINIMBAH MATTERS**

Minimbah Rural Fire Brigade has been very busy this past month, with training being high priority. Extinguishing a fat or petrol fire and also a gas fire was informative and well worthwhile, but we hope we are never called upon to put it into practice at your place.



Tuncurry Fire Station was the venue for some group training with Members from Tuncurry, Krambach, Diamond Beach, Nabiac, and Rainbow Flat Brigades in an extensive pumping and water relaying exercise. The biggest challenge of the day was the mosquitoes. It is so rewarding to be involved in this sort of activity from both a social and an operational point of view. We learn and we laugh during these sessions because at training some funny things do happen, and they are all part of the learning process. Thank you Tuncurry for inviting us.

On the subject of training .... we now have another qualified Village Firefighter in our Brigade. Congratulations *Trev*.

Minimbah Brigade was fortunate enough recently to be at Mid Coast Water's (MCW) bore field and water treatment plant at the war time airstrip in Aerodrome Road. We were shown through this computer-controlled facility which was, at the time of our visit, processing 4 mega litres of water a day (it has a capability of 8 mega litres per day) and pumping it to the storage and distribution complex on The Lakes Way at Darawank. This supplements the water currently supplied to the region from the Bootawa pumping plant on the upper Manning River.

Subsequent to the disastrous fires in the area in 2017, MCW have provided a hydrant within their complex, for use by the Rural Fire Service (RFS) in an emergency. Thanks guys.

#### DATES FOR YOUR DIARY

Monday 1<sup>st</sup> April. The statutory Bush Fire Danger Period has ended in the Mid Coast District. There is no longer the legal requirement to have a fire permit before you tackle any burning off. There does remain, however, a legal requirement to prepare the area around your proposed burn site properly, to give to your neighbours and the RFS, at least 24 hours' notice of your intentions to burn, and to ensure the fire does not leave your property. Ignoring these requirements can have serious consequences. Would you be happy to have part of your property burnt un-necessarily; to have your washing smelling like a bush fire; to have a serious asthma attack; to receive a substantial fine for being negligent? Didn't think so. It's not hard — it's just consideration and common sense.




Last week our software supplier combined all the library information from the former Gloucester/Great Lakes and Manning Valley library databases into a single MidCoast Libraries system.





The new **animal nursery** went down a treat with the kiddies and I would have liked to linger a bit myself to see the baby animals.

The **Goats** were well presented again, as were the Beef Cattle. The **Beef Cattle** are increasing every year with the entries from Chatham High & Taree Christian College schools increasing, which is a a good sign that the kids involved will, hopefully, stay on the land when they leave school and keep the industry going. They took out a lot of the Beef prizes.

The **Showjumping** was well represented this year. An increase in entries on the last couple of years and the **Horse Ring** events seemed to be well represented as well.




#### REAL KULTCHA

#### Permaculture in the Garden

SOIL! PART 2

Last month I began an article soil and the role of microbes, focusing on bacteria. This month I'm going to tackle my favourite microorganism FUNGI which is an incredibly important organism for the garden (helps improve soil quality) and for many other things in our lives!

So far, we know of around 100,000 different kinds of fungi (this includes moulds and yeasts) and some suggest that there are over a million more we're yet to discover.

While most people think of mushrooms when they think fungi, these are actually just the fruiting body of the bigger organism that generally stays under ground. If you've ever been in the forest or garden and swept back some leaves to find a network of white strands...you were looking at Mycelia which is the rest of the organism. These networks can cover huge amounts of distance and the largest organism in the world is thought to be the honey fungus spanning 3.8km across the blue mountains in Oregon, US.

While bacteria like the fresh green scraps, fungi really love the woody stuff (lignin) like sticks and logs and branches. That's why you'll often see fungi growing on logs lying on the ground. This makes them particularly helpful in the garden helping to break down bigger, thicker stuff. While a lot of fungi likes wood, certain types of fungi will eat deadly chemicals and even oil! In fact, trials using fungi to clean up oil spills and other contaminated sites have been very

successful. "6 ways fungi can save the world" by Paul Stamets is a fascinating short video about this and can be found on youtube.

There are lots of different types of fungi but Mycorrhizal fungi is one of the most interesting. This type of fungi live in and around the roots of the plants in a symbiotic relationship with plants essentially as an extension of the root system. One organism can be connected to many different plants which creates a network. The plants can talk to each other through the network, sending messages and swapping (or stealing) nutrients. Dying trees can send their nutrients to young saplings, species can send out warnings when they're under attack from predatory insects and whole species have been found to support new species when changes to the climate mean they can no longer grow in that environment. This network is called the wood-wide-web and we are only just beginning to understand it.

Not all kinds of fungi are our friends in the garden. I'm sure many people have struggled at some point with fungal disease but if you have healthy soil with plenty of organic matter and a healthy soil eco-system your microbes should keep each other in check.

This is a big topic for a small article and I've only just touched on the role of fungi in our garden without even mentioning their many medicinal properties so if you would like any more information, send me an email or give me a call! freerangechange@gmail.com 0473 372 825





#### Lyn's Larder

With the cooler weather starting up, I thought a warm, light soup might be called for as a quick meal or lunch.

CORN CHOWDER WITH PRAWNS AND RED CAPSICUMS (Readers Digest)

#### INGREDIENTS.

2 tbsp Olive or vegetable oil
1 lge Onion, finely chopped
1 lge Potato, peeled and diced
1 Bay leaf
½ tsp Dried marjoram
% tsp Ground nutmeg
134 cups Chicken stock
1 can Creamed corn (420g)

1 can Creamed corn (420g) 300g Frozen corn kernels, thawed 1¾ cups Milk

1/4 tsp Black pepper

250g can Red capsicums (pimientos), drained and thinly sliced <u>or</u> 250g Roasted red capsicums, skinned, cored, seeded & sliced

500g Large green prawns, shelled and deveined.

#### **METHOD**

- Heat the oil for one minute in a large saucepan over moderate heat. Add the onion and sauté, stirring, until it is limp - about 5 minutes.
- Add the potato, bay leaf, marjoram, nutmeg and stock and bring to a boil. Lower the heat to moderate, cover and cook at a gentle boil until the potato is just tender, about 10 minutes.
- Add the creamed corn, corn kernels, milk and black pepper and bring to a rapid boil. Lower the heat to moderate, add the red capsicums and prawns and boil gently, uncovered, until the prawns are just cooked through - about 3 minutes. Remove the bay leaf and serve.

Serve with crispy "biscotte" or fresh baguette slices.

Serves 6. To keep the prawns tender serve this Chowder straight away. If you must reheat it, do it gently over a very low heat.

#### **Across Aromatherapy**

his month I thought that I would write about some of the benefits of using essential oils as part of your skin care regime.

Many years ago a speaker at a conference on aromatherapy said "If you can't eat it don't put it on your skin." I must say I was surprised, but went away and thought about it, and he was right. The skin does rapidly absorb anything put on it, and this is taken up by the blood stream and distributed around the body, much as food once it has been digested would be. There are some medications that are used by putting a patch on your skin. The message is only put quality products on your face but that doesn't necessarily mean expensive!

Essential oils can be used to make beautiful skin care products. Start with any good oil, such as coconut or sweet almond oil to use as a base. (Olive oil is too heavy for your face, but ok on hands and legs.) Alternatively you can buy a base cream and add essential oils to it. Other oils that can be used as a base include Evening Primrose and Jojoba. Jojoba oil leaves a protective layer over your skin, so if you are working in the garden or walking along the beach on a windy day, jojoba oil will protect your skin from the elements. Evening Primrose in a 5% strength is particularly good as it helps with age spots, dry skin and acne.

Some essential oils that you can add to your base include:

- \* Sandalwood (Indian not Australian) essential oil softens dry mature skin, reduces wrinkles and soothes sunburn, it's also a good anti-oxidant. (Australian Sandalwood has antiinflammatory properties and is quite a different oil.)
- \* German Chamomile essential oil can be helpful in reducing facial redness. It is expensive, but you can buy 3% German Chamomile and just pat a drop on your skin.
- \* Rose essential oil is also a lovely oil to use on your skin. Using a base cream or oil add German Chamomile, 3% Calendula and Rose to make a good combination for those who have skin that reacts to everything. Pure Rose essential oil is very expensive, but Rose Absolute or Rose Maroc is more affordable.

Floral oils such as German and Roman Chamomile, Jasmine Absolute, Neroli, and Rose Absolute or Rose Otto are recommended for dry skins. Personal preference is important, so other essential oils you could consider are Geranium, Lavender, Palmarosa, Rosewood and Sandalwood. Remember that regular massage (which you can do yourself) will increase circulation of the capillaries that nourish the skin, so is beneficial for dry skin.

For an oily skin a combination of equal parts of Lavender and Geranium can be particularly beneficial in a base of apricot or jojoba. Take care to leave this on your face for a short period only, then remove it with a cleanser. Geranium will regulate the sebum in the skin and is known to have a balancing effect on the endocrine system, while Lavender is antiseptic, healing and calming on the skin. Never use harsh soaps on an oily skin. Other essential oils you can consider are cypress, geranium, grapefruit and cedarwood.

Acne may be cleared up using Palmarosa essential oil. Take a hand towel and using warm water with a few drops of Palma Rosa sprinkled onto it make a compress and place it over your face 3 times a week. Persist as it may take a couple of months to clear!
