#### **Nabiac Memorial Neighbourhood** Centre

hen our Op Shop reopened in July, one of our new volunteers gave us a copy of a news article dated 20<sup>th</sup> February 1985. The article was written by Margaret Fens, Secretary of the then newly formed Nabiac Memorial Neighbourhood Centre.

Margaret described how, after 4 years and much negotiation, the old Hospital land and building would be kept "in the hands of the community. It will be called the Nabiac Memorial Neighbourhood Centre. For the newcomers to the area, the word 'War' has been dropped from the old name and 'Memorial' kept as a tribute to the many people in the past who made the purchase of the land and the building possible so long ago. The building gave good service to us as a Hospital, and now it will continue to give even greater service to the community by having a multiple use....

Funds to convert the building and purchase equipment were raised by the Committee. "The Committee's funds also paid for all of the alterations and additions for the Pre-school which has been operating for almost a year and which has surpassed all expectations. This has been achieved through the foresight of the Committee for the Centre and the hard work of the Pre-school Committee in preparation for the

Pre-school. All local labour has been used for all repairs and building alterations and all purchases for equipment made locally, in order to stay along the lines of community involvement...We have a long way to go, and with your support for its use, the Centre will be a great asset to the community......If we want something badly enough, we'll work for it and get it. This is your Neighbourhood Centre. We hope that you'll support it in whatever way you can....It can only be achieved by community involvement."

Some years after Margaret wrote this, the Op Shop had its humble beginnings as a Clothing Pool run by volunteers. The Op Shop developed in leaps and bounds over the years, providing both funds for quite impressive community projects, and a hub for reusing and recycling. It also provided an opportunity for the community to volunteer in the day to day operation of the Op Shop.

With the coming of COVID19 this year the Op Shop closed from March through to July. During this time, a number of our volunteers, some of them long term volunteers, decided not to return on reopening of the Op Shop.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank ALL of the volunteers associated with the OP Shop over so many years. Their volunteering has been part of the growth of our Neighbourhood Centre as an asset of our community.



ow, I am not surprised this boy I tested recently, finds reading difficult! The year 3 boy avoids reading and feels exhausted at the end of a school day, often with a headache. He described what the page of print looked like and he was very descriptive saying that he couldn't see the word I was pointing to on the page because it 'disconnects' and showed me with his finger how one letter moves above the line and the next letter moves below the line and all the words on the page are doing that! He also said words 'break apart in the middle, some moving up, some moving down'.

What he describes is similar to the 'Seesaw effect' in this picture. He kept looking away from the page as it was difficult for him to look at. He said the white background on the page looked 'fizzy' with a sparkling, flickering effect, hurting his eyes.

When we found his irlen overlay colour, he was not only able to see the word, he was able to read a whole paragraph! He said the words no longer moved and the background wasn't 'fizzy', he could see the words and the page clearly! He is looking forward to further assessment to get his Irlen Lenses and to get reading!!!

#### **MINIMBAH MATTERS**

**M** inimbah Rural Fire Brigade doesn't usually ask much, but when we do, we are amazed by the positive response. Now we have a BIG ASK!

With the exception of a few days of severe winds, the current conditions are well suited for lighting up those piles, wind rows and other general areas of accumulated dry material you have on your property. By now you all know the rules that apply to burning off, so please, do yourselves, your neighbours and your local Rural Fire Brigade a huge favour - get stuck in and prepare your property for the coming Bush Fire Danger Period. We can hope, but there is no rule that says we can't have consecutive horrendous fire seasons.

#### DO IT NOW PLEASE

Or to put it more friendly ....

"The time has come", the Fireys said,
"To talk of many things:
Of leaves - and trees - and dangerous goods Of Survival Plans - who to ring.
And what to do if there's no power And what the fire season brings.

Now is the time", the Fireys said,
"To stack those sticks - get gloves and hat
Just because it's cold and wet right now
Don't sit around all day and chat.
It won't be long before spring returns
And it's too late to deal with that.

High piles are scary", the Fireys said
"So best keep them long and low
If you live on acres - there are some takers It takes days to burn a wind-row
The fire is yours, so keep it close by To the neighbours it must not go

'Twill be Permit time soon", the Fireys said
"And thus we surely beseech:
All gutters are cleared - all rubbish removed There's nothing an ember can reach.
Burn what you must - your judgement we trust
Please - Listen to what we do preach."

When burning off, at <u>least 24 hours before</u> you light up, you are required to notify your neighbours, and the RFS.

Our Brigade is multi-tasking in a very up to the moment kind of way at present.

Keeping within the Covid-19 guidelines we are carrying out some small but vital training sessions especially for those Members who are aiming to extend their qualifications to the next level. This means that Crew Leader and Advanced Fire Fighter contenders, and the instructors, are checking the updated Covid-19 regulations every time they attend a training session. Hand sanitizing – tick! Social distancing - tick! Don't come if you are coughing, etc. In fact, we have recommended the entire Brigade undertakes the online Government Infection Control course because, regardless of how few people attend, the Certificate that is issued must be produced at any meetings, training or assessment run by the NSW Rural Fire Service.

Our *Get Ready Day* was planned for 12<sup>th</sup> September, but in all probability, it is highly **Unlikely** that it will go ahead on that day. You know why – Covid-19 restrictions. The best we can offer you is "it will happen but it won't happen overnight". Our Get Ready Day may eventually be in Autumn next year when we will be able to give you some alarming info and preparation pointers about winter fires. Which brings to mind the following little gems:

#### Don't sleep with a wheat bag at night, it might ignite.

Wheat bags can ignite, and are not designed to replace hot water bottles for warming beds. Regularly check your wheat bag for signs of wear and tear or scorching. With age, the fillings dry out and become combustible. Only use wheat bags for direct application to body aches and pains.

### Electric blankets can warm you in winter, but take care to use them safely.

According to the July, 2020 edition of *Choice* Magazine, "almost 33,000 electric blankets and throws have been recalled since 2016. Electric blankets can be used safely if you maintain and check them properly, particularly if they've been in storage during the warmer months. It is never recommended you leave them on overnight, even if the manufacturer claims it's safe to do so."

#### From the Captain


Been quiet for all Brigades this last little while. We don't expect this to last and you guys can help. It may be winter but a few days of sunshine will change things considerably.

his month's "spot the weed" challenge is the succulent, Mother-of-Millions;

its lovely red-orange flowers are standing up proudly at the moment. No, the drought didn't kill them and they are back! No, don't tell me - but do yourself a favour and get rid of them before they spread. If you want to learn more about this weed consult WeedWise.



https://weeds.dpi.nsw.gov.au/Weeds/MotherOfMillions . Yes, it can kill cows and dogs. If you see Mother-of-Millions on public land or have neighbours who are irresponsible, contact your local Midcoast Council weeds officer.

The two Nabiac Landcare teams are continuing the follow up weeding of our two sites. The team at Bullock Wharf has just about finished its blitz on white passionfruit and now have been heard saying "There are millions of b\*@#\* baby camphor laurels coming up along the Nabiac Street end of the reserve".



A weed brought in from Bullock Wharf for identification is the Chinese or Golden Rain Tree (Koelreuteria elegans subsp. formosana). This is a garden escapee that is quite invasive in warmer areas and has the capacity to do environmental damage. We have found

numerous 10-20 cm high seedlings along the Donaldson Street side of the reserve. I'm not sure their appearance is due to the combination of environmental conditions that we have experienced or that a tree has recently matured and is seeding in the local area. https://weeds.dpi.nsw.gov.au/Weeds/ ChineseRainTree

Nabiac Landcare works each Wednesday (weather permitting) 8-9am to 11am, followed by morning tea. Membership is only \$2.00 plus an occasional donation to the morning tea fund and new members are always welcome. Training, tools and safety gear supplied. Give us a ring if you are interested.

Remember, even if you can't help in the bush, you can do your bit for our lovely area by removing weeds from your own backyard and removing fruit and seeds from exotic plants that the birds and wind will spread. Most of all enjoy the local bush!

Let's keep those articles and reports being forwarded for publication.





#### Show News

After a false start due to the power outage and nasty weather, the Show Committee undertook a cautious return to face-to-face meetings this month. Good COVID distancing and hygiene were practiced, of course.



During the meeting it was confirmed that due to our delayed start back to 'work', the AGM this year will be held at our September meeting. That's **Tuesday 8**<sup>th</sup>, **7.30pm at the Showground Hall**.

At last Saturday's Farmers' Markets, many of you will have seen the progression of work being undertaken per the NSW Government Show-grounds Stimulus Funding (F/Y 2019/20) grant we received.

These improvements include work to the ring and top gate on Showground Lane. At the ring the old timber posts along Nabiac Street have been replaced with metal posts, to standardise the fencing. Timber rails are being installed and replaced as needs be. The final detail will be a complete new paint job. It will be much safer and more visible once completed.

For safety purposes, in consultation with MidCoast Council, the pedestrian and vehicle access at the top gate have been separated. The roadway was been extended in line with the gate changes, with road base laid and the surplus soil relocated for the creation of garden beds. (Photo attached)

At the completion of these Grant funded works, the Committee plans to undertake some additional beautification works not included in the original scope. We'll be making a call in the near future, for volunteers to participate in a working bee.

The newly repaired awning at the western end of the Luncheon Room and the new railing are in need of painting, and we'll include the top gate ticket box to give it a spruce up. For those who are not painters, there's the opportunity to create and plant the new gardens on Showground Lane.



#### **Show Development Grant received from Federal** Government for Nabiac Showground

The Australian Government, through the Regional Agricultural Show Development Grant program, is supporting the Wallamba District Show Committee in upgrading the entry to the Nabiac Showground.

The President of the Wallamba Show, Mr John Baker, said "Our vision for this project is a more aesthetically pleasing and functional entry point to the Showground off Nabiac Street."

"The benefits of this project are many, however the two most obvious are, creating a sense of arrival at the Ground and safely managing the entry for all-ability pedestrians and vehicle visitors."

"Currently during events such as the annual Wallamba District Show, visitors are forced to line up along the edge of a relatively narrow road while heavy vehicular traffic makes its way past", Mr Baker said.

Federal Member for Lyne, Dr David Gillespie was a supporter of our application and said Agricultural shows are the heart and soul of our regional communities and provide an important opportunity for primary producers to come together and support each other.


"Country shows like the Nabiac Show bring and keep communities together and provide a key injection into the local economy.'

"The funding and associated works will see our local show and the show ground continue to grow in size and popularity, I want to see our agriculture shows to be enjoyed for generations to come," Dr Gillespie said.

Mr Baker said MidCoast Council have been an enthusiastic supporter of the project that will involve the construction of a new ticket entry point, improved drainage and landscaping work on the Nabiac Street road side, as well as an all-ability pathway that will lead from the front entry up to the Library.

"The funding Dr Gillespie secured will also allow us to install directional and informative signage at the entry that will improve the visitor experience and lead to greater utilisation of the Ground's assets," Mr Baker concluded.

#### **NEW LOOK FOR NABIAC SHOWGROUND** YEARS The entry point to the Nabiac Showground is about to

undergo a major facelift. As anyone who has visited the Showgrounds lately would know, the front gate and its

surrounds are looking a little tired.

All this is about to change with five key aspects of the entry to undergo substantial works.

With the support of the MidCoast Council (MCC) the Nabiac Street side of the ground will have a concrete apron constructed from the fence to the road to provide a safer pre-entry point without having to dodge cars and trucks.

At this stage it is envisaged that the apron will span approximately 15 metres across the front.

Issues like better drainage and landscaping will be addressed to improve the areas visual appeal.

The front entry gate is being moved approximately 5 metres further away from the main hall and will be widened to allow two-way traffic.

The area currently being used as the entry road, will be hard surfaced to a width of 5 metres to provide an all-ability pedestrian access from the new entry point up to the Library.

Construction of a ticket/pedestrian entry point on the Hall side of the current driveway will complement this work and in these more uncertain times, allow organisers better control of numbers coming into the ground.

To ensure that both visitors and locals will know that they have arrived at the showground, an archway sign will be designed to span proudly over the new entrance way stating NABIAC SHOWGROUND.

The project is being managed jointly by the MCC and the Wallamba Show Committee with consultation already taking place between these parties and an engineer.

Local trades and suppliers will be used in the project that will be completed in time for next year's show on 6<sup>th</sup> March, 2021.



#### Artist of the Month – Deborah Knoke, Artist and Market Coordinator Nabiac Farmers Markets chats with *Kate Landsberry*

Born in Stoke on Trent, Staffordshire, England, Deborah grew up in the area known as 'The Potteries' and home to Royal Doulton, Royal Albert, Wedgewood and Minton's.

At 15, and with a passion and talent for art, Deborah was offered opportunity to attend Leek College of Art however 'becoming an artist' wasn't a general choice in her town at that time, and Deborah chose instead to take up a local traineeship with Minton China learning the skilled craft and trade of 'best gold gilder'. Here she would add the fine gilded detail using either 18 or 22ct gold to the various pieces of tea sets and dinner ware.. A highlight of these times was to work on the gilding of a dinner service for the Shah of Iran. Deborah then worked for Royal Albert, part of the Royal Doulton group, on such sought after collectable patterns as "Old Country Roses"

It was work she enjoyed for over 10 years before making the huge decision to move to Australia in 1981. With 2 young children, Deborah became a single mother, fitting various work around her family. In 1986 Deborah and *Robert* met, marrying and moving to Thirlmere on the South Coast of NSW, where they purchased a small run-down acreage and, with the goal of self-sufficiency, created a herb nursery. Deborah also began working for the Macarthur Country Tourist Association and, within 18 months was Tourism Manager for Liverpool, Campbelltown, Camden and Wollondilly councils

(Macarthur Region) – a sizable challenge with a family and home business to run! Deb loved working in tourism and promoting the area she lived in.

Life changed with another baby on the way and Deborah finally started painting again, working in ceramics and adding a craft shop to the herb nursery. Under the name of Avalon Herb and Fragrance Garden, Deborah created a medieval theme based on the Arthurian Legends operating from home and attending the local markets. Returning to part-time work, Deborah took up a position at Wollondilly Council, setting up a community nursery, working in bush regeneration and with local land groups. This role became full time and Deborah became Councils Environmental Officer - Community Projects. In 2001 Deborah joined MACROC, an alliance of three local councils and became the Agri (Rural) Tourism Office for the area a 12 months project assisting local producers and growers and establishing the Camden Produce Markets which is still a huge success today. After the project finished, she created her own business Farmgate Rural Tourism and established the Macarthur Growers

Association and continued operating the markets for local growers and hobby farmers.

Deborah is amazingly energetic, always up for a challenge and with the ability to apply what she knows, learn the rest as she goes and have a good laugh as needed! In 2003 work took Robert to the UK for 3 years where Deb had the chance for what she feels was her most rewarding work, as mentor and student liaison officer for marginalised children entering high school. Here Deb worked with kids often written off by society and systems, helping them to find a seed of hope and value, a greater understanding of self and the skills to begin to make different life choices.

In early 2007 Deborah (now returned to Australia) found herself in a mundane job looking for new direction. The sad emotional loss of her father in the UK, proved a catalyst to her resigning to finally study art – the opportunity she had not taken at 16. With 'first day at school' excitement she began learning drawing, painting, printmaking and ceramics, completing initial Visual Arts studies and then studies in Aboriginal art and culture.

Of course, Deb went on to create a small business under her studio name "Midsummer Artistry" exhibiting and attending the local Creative Traders market in Picton, NSW.

In 2016 Deborah and Robert made the move to Krambach and began a year of renovations to their now much-loved Dream Catcher Lodge. They have both embraced the opportunity to be involved with the local community, garden, land and artist groups.

In 2018, Deborah was invited to take over the coordination of Nabiac Farmers Market, and now with Robert on board, they share the same passion. Deborah has continued her artistic journey working in acrylic paints, with recycled and repurposed materials and with wood burning in her studio, with Robert assisting with his wood working skills. She has won several awards in Nabiac Show and is an active member of Artists of Wallamba, exhibiting work regularly. Now looking toward further study, it seems likely whatever Deborah undertakes, will see new and exciting results!

Paff: Many friends throughout the district of the Wallamba and Manning heard with great regret on Monday morning of the sudden death of Mr Henry John Jacob Baptist Paff of Bulby, one of the best known dairy cattle breeders in the upper Wallamba district. He was one of the most progressive farmers in that district and took a keen interest in all matters attaining to the success of the men who followed dairying for a living At the annual meeting of the Upper Wallamba Co-Operative Dairy Society he was always a regular attendant and contributed much to the debates therewith. He was a seeker for information in the best sense of the word with a view to constructional results and he was always listened to with attention. It appears that he recently purchased a property at Firefly Creek some 12 miles from Gloucester and with one of his sons was out there about 2:30pm on Sunday afternoon last discussing the matter of whether it should be fenced right off or sub- divided. While they were conversing in the bush his son heard a crack above them and called out to his father, but before the latter could get to safety a limb came down and struck him conflicting fatal injuries. They had not been under the tree more than a few seconds, when the limb broke above them. Dr Munroe, of Gloucester was sent for but the patient was dead before he arrived. We understand that an inquest will be held on Monday next. The late Mr Paff was a son of Mr & Mrs Patrick Paff of Firefly Creek where he was born and lived nearly all his life with the exception of a few years spent on the Richmond River. For the last 20 years he has had his own property at Bulby Brush where he built up a very fine herd of A.I.s dairy cattle. He married Miss Bridget Hogan who lived on the Wallamba River. A widow and five children survive.

On Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> October the Lord Bishop of the Diocese will visit the parish and lay the foundation stone. It is expected a large gathering will witness the important event.

During the holidays Mr *Roger Lee*, teacher at Macksville, paid a visit to his sister, Mrs *George Paff*. Roger is a corporal in the militia and was on his way to Sydney to undergo a period of training.

Mr White, who until recently was on Milligan's farm, has moved to Belbora and Mr Mel Stevens has moved into Nabiac. We welcome Mr Leon Schneider to our midst. He has taken over Mr Murrays farm at Cocumbark. Miss Ina Cook has just completed a very pleasing holiday with her brother in law and sister, Mrs Whyte-Butler Miss Ina still appreciates a return to her favoured locality, the Wallamba. Little Roderick, son of Mr and Mrs Harry Croker, recently had a nasty fall from his horse when the girth broke and he dislocated his elbow.



#### INDIAN BEEF CURRY

#### INGREDIENTS

1kg Topside steak cut into 21/2 cm cubes

Onions (medium)

2 Cloves Garlic - crushed

1 tsp **Tumeric** 

Cumin 1 tsp

1 dsp Coriander

**Ground Ginger** 1 tsp Paprika 1 tsp

125 g Butter

(4oz old measure) small Bay leaves

120 ml

Yoghurt - plain (Greek) (¼ pint old measure) Garam Masala 1 tsp

Salt

Thinly slice 2 onions. Chop other 2 very finely and combine with crushed garlic, tumeric, cumin, coriander, ginger and paprika.

Heat butter in a pan, sauté sliced onions until golden brown. Add onion mixture, fry 3 minutes, stirring constantly. Add meat, season to taste with salt; reduce heat and fry for 5 minutes. Add bayleaves, yoghurt, cover, reduce heat, and simmer until meat is almost tender. Add garam masala, simmer covered, until meat is tender.

Serve with boiled rice, pappadams, thin cucumber slices in yoghurt, dried coconut, diced tomatoes and mango chutney or lemon for a great

Note: Yoghurt should be room temperature before adding to curry; this will ensure it does not curdle when added to the hot liquid.

As my husband liked HOT curry I would pop in a couple of very small dried red chillies.. Be careful using them, they are very hot.


