MINIMBAH MATTERS

Minimbah Rural Fire Brigade quite often has their name mis-pronounced as Mini-bah. Sometimes it is an honest mistake and other times it is a joke with a hotel mini bar in mind. Well the joke's on them. We would like to send a huge shout out to the talented gentlemen at the Forster Tuncurry Men's Shed who produced this wonderful piece for the Crew Room at our Fire Station. The photo does not do it justice. It is truly a magnificent piece of work for which we are very grateful and proud-as-punch to display. Call in to the Men's Shed at the Tuncurry Tip complex one day – you will be amazed at what they do.



The dreaded Covid-19 restrictions are still being enforced across the State. The impact of these restrictions on the NSW Rural Fire Service (RFS) means that we are not permitted to carry out any non-essential training or meetings at present. Even scheduled District Medal Presentation Ceremonies have been cancelled. Only activities deemed to be essential, such as responding to fire calls or motor vehicle accidents and the like.

The weather hasn't been particularly conducive to lighting outdoor fires or burning off recently, but we have noticed some smallish burns being carried out in the smallish windows of opportunity.

One Round TO-IT Issued at Minimbah July 2021 If you are planning on getting **a-round-to-it** and have children to "help" you, why not take the opportunity to make them aware of the potential risk that fire can present. Nothing too deep and meaningful that may frighten them, especially the smaller children. Just little things like being aware of flying embers; don't walk too close to a bonfire or campfire; don't walk between another person and the fire – go around the back of the person.

Minimbah July 2021 Remembering to make sure fires are fully extinguished before you leave them is extremely important. Fires may look safe, but with the winds we have been having lately, they will spring to life before you know it. If you are away from the fire they could do some serious damage without being noticed.

Please be very mindful of the frequent and rather sudden changing weather conditions if you are lighting up, and remember to give your neighbours and local fire authority at least 24 hours' notice.

Not much news from the Committee of the Neighbourhood Centre. We have decided to cancel our August meeting due to COVID. We are planning for our AGM to go ahead in October, date to be advised.

As of 30^{th} June 2021 there were 144 members of the Neighbourhood Centre.

Many of these members belong to the sub groups of the Neighbourhood Centre – the Nook, Nabiac Landcare, Nabiac Second Chance Opportunity Shop, Aub Ferris Sporting Fields Redevelopment, Nabiac Community Technology Centre, Mid Coast Community Quilters, Nabiac Village Futures Group and Nabiac Farmers Market.

The members of these groups are all volunteers. Their Volunteers Insurance is arranged through the Neighbourhood Centre. Between now and September we will be asking all groups to send us their revised lists of members (as of 1st July) if they wish to continue membership.

Again we would like to remind the local community of how fortunate we were to be set up as a Neighbourhood Centre Association when the old Wallamba War Memorial Hospital closed in the early 1980's. The Centre has changed a little over the past 40 years in what is offered there, but on the whole it continues to provide sustainability, education, support and opportunity to the people of Nabiac and surrounding areas.

Nabiac Landcare

The Nabiac Landcare team has been trying to get as much work done as possible with the soft soil making weed pulling easier. Unfortunately, we have had to have time off due to the high winds. Safety comes first and working under eucalypts when it's windy isn't a great idea. There are branches down and some casuarinas in the northern area of Lilypilly Bend have fallen over.

It is disappointing to see damage to the tracks at LPB caused mainly by dirt bikes and quad bikes using the tracks in the wet. This damage has increased considerably in the past couple of months and makes it very difficult for walkers.

Three common weeds in this area that can be difficult to control are privet, camphor laurel and ochna—*Micky Mouse*(→) bush. They have some traits in common, they are all tough, drought tolerant and set many

juicy black seeds for birds to spread. If at all possible attack these weeds when they are young. It's been quite easy lately to pull seedling in the soft earth. "I'll get around to them later" is not a great



attitude especially if one doesn't remember just where in 'the back 40' they were. I often carry some bright coloured surveyors tape in my pocket and will mark a weed that I can't pull for later attention. This is especially important for weeds like cassia (Senna species) that are only easily noticed when they are flowering.

When poisoning these difficult weeds it is vitally important to use poison only when the plant is actively growing and not stressed. Winter may not be a good time. If poisoned incorrectly these plants will sucker from the roots or coppice from the base. Check with the Weedwise website (https://weeds.dpi.nsw.gov.au/) for the recommended poisons, concentrations and methods of application

Butter Beans & Parsley

INGREDIENTS

Leeks, trimmed and thickly sliced

Courgettes, thickly sliced

25g Margarine Plain flour

25g 450mls

2x400q Cans Butter beans, drained and rinsed

Chopped fresh Parsley 6 tbsp

25g Fresh Wholemeal breadcrumbs

50g Mature Cheddar Cheese, grated.

Salt & Pepper to taste

METHOD

Cook the leeks and courgettes in 2.5cm boiling water until just tender, then drain

Melt the margarine in a saucepan then add the flour, stir in and cook for 1 minute. Add the milk, stirring until thick. Bring to the boil, lower the heat and season.

Add the leeks, courgettes, butter beans and 4 tablespoons of the parsley to the sauce and mix well. Turn the mixture into an oven proof serving dish.

Mix together breadcrumbs, cheese and remaining parsley and sprinkle over evenly over the top.

Bake at 200° C (400°Fh) for 30 minutes. Maybe a little less if using a fan forced oven.







The Wallamba Watershed's History — Another in a series of historical articles gleaned from the archives of the "Manning River Times, 1941 - 1942 by Bob Mann

COUNCIL MEETING - AUGUST, 1941: At the Manning Shire Council meeting held on the 11th August, the main business connected to the Upper Wallamba District was culverts. The ones on the Cocumbark Road. The Nabiac via Dargavilles Crossing road, four culverts on the Cocumbark - Wang Wauk Road and the two culverts on the Bunyah Road via Waterloo Road. The position regarding the letting of these contracts was most unsatisfactory. The accepted tenderer, S.J. Donaldson, had made no attempt to sign the contracts. It was recommended that the contracts be re advertised.

KARKATT W. V. S.: The annual report of the Karkatt Women's Voluntary Service to the year 5th August showed the following articles had been made for the soldiers. 79 pairs of socks, 24 balaclava caps, 38 scarves, 15 pullovers, 22 pairs mittens, 23 pairs long socks, 6 night caps, 48 handkerchiefs, 101 washers, 10 cutlery bags, 9 carryalls, 5 pairs pyjamas, 16 toothbrushes, 18 tubes toothpaste, 19 cakes soap, 7 hussits, 27 rifle cleaners. The service also sent overseas 4 packets razor blades, 4 combs, matches and cigarettes, 28 packets PKS chewing gum, 2 tins tobacco, 3 books, 1lb chocolates and 8 packets biscuits.

BULBY STUD - SEPTEMBER, 1941: Mr *Milligan,* Principal of Messrs E.W. Milligan & Sons of Bulby Jersey Stud, informs us that Mr *W. Bishop* of Bryland, Queensland, won the under 3 years bull class at the Brisbane Royal Show with the N.S.W. bred 'Bulby Oxford Gamboge' bred by Mr E.W. Milligan & Sons. Mr Milligan is proud of the bull's achievement.

NABIAC - OCTOBER 1941 - Truck In River:. On Saturday last a truck belonging to Mr *T.P. Holden* of Nabiac ran backwards on the Cundle ferry and plunged into the Manning River. Manning River Motors N.R.M.A. breakdown truck succeeded in extricating the submerged truck from the river.

TERRIFIC STORM AT NABIAC. DAMAGE BY HAIL: A particularly severe hailstorm struck Nabiac about 1:15pm on Thursday afternoon. All the





windows at the residence of Mr Paff's garage were broken as well as all the glass in seven bowsers. At Walden's Hotel two iron tanks were riddled as if from rifle shooting. The bedroom windows upstairs were also broken and the rooms flooded. Windows at the Bank of NSW residence and Hancock's and Weller's were also broken, in fact windows were broken everywhere. Mr Buderus had completed some painting at the Bank of NSW and the hail chipped the new paint off as thought it had been scraped. Mr Jansen had a car hood cut and ruined. Our informant states that the hail was the largest he has seen, it being larger than bantam eggs and jagged. The storm that passed over the valley of the Wallamba shortly before 2pm on Thursday was visible from Taree but not a sprinkle fell in the area, it appeared to proceed at great speed towards the sea, however about 4pm the valley of the Manning or part of it had a storm visitation and at Taree there was considerable thunder and lightning and about 80 points of rain was recorded. At Coopernook and the Upper Lansdowne practically no rain fell. There was hail at Darawank on the Wallamba but none at Tuncurry. It is reported that he storm was very heavy at Krambach and district.

BUNYAH BRIDGE: At last weeks meeting of the Stroud Shire Council word was received that the Department could not make a further grant towards the cost of the construction of the Bunyah Bridge.

KRAMBACH SPORTS AND RACES. A very successful day's sports was held on the Krambach race course last Saturday, August 13th, 1942. In addition to many bridle races the programme comprised flag races, bending races, brush hurdles, high jumps. 

FIGHT FOR MORE LANES ACROSS THE WATER GAINS



MOMENTUM

The fight to gain more lanes between Forster and Tuncurry has gained momentum, with the petition now exceeding its halfway point in under three months.

In April, Member for Myall Lakes, Stephen Bromhead called upon the community who live in or visit the Forster-Tuncurry region to sign the petition.

"It's extremely encouraging to see that more than 5,000 people have put pen to paper and signed their name to the cause" Mr Bromhead said.

"This showcases the immense public support for extra lanes between the twin-towns, but the fight isn't over yet. We need a further 5,000 signatures to reach our goal of 10,000 signatures which will allow us to debate this on the floor of Parliament and bring this issue to the forefront of the NSW Government."

"In April, a tragic fatal accident closed the bridge causing a huge issue for emergency services and those looking to get across the water. It exposed how vulnerable we are without an alternative route nearby" Mr Bromhead said.

At present, Bulahdelah offers another route, but adds a further 90minutes to a journey to get from Tuncurry to Forster or vice-versa.

"We've already seen the success of a petition like this with the Forster Public Hospital, so I'm again calling on everyone who lives in or visits Forster Tuncurry, and who hasn't already, to sign this petition and help me in the fight for a further two lanes connecting our picturesque twin-towns."





Election postponed

NSW Local Government elections have been postponed by a further three

months, in response to the current COVID-19 situation.

The election will now take place on Saturday 4th December.


Announcing the new date, Local Government Minister Shelley Hancock said the decision to postpone the election for a second time had been made to ensure the safety and wellbeing of the state's communities, voters, polling staff and candidates.

Nominations for candidates to contest the poll will now open on Monday 25th October. The electoral roll, including the non-residential roll, will also remain open until this date.

Councillors elected in December 2021 will serve a reduced term of two years and eight months, with subsequent elections expected to remain on schedule. This means the next election will proceed as planned in September, 2024.

FORSTER PUBLIC HOSPITAL – LET'S SET THE RECORD STRAIGHT

Member for Myall Lakes Stephen Bromhead has today spoken out to set the record straight about plans for a public hospital in Forster-Tuncurry.

This comes after misinformation being circulated in the community, stating that there was no mention of a public hospital in Forster within the recent clinical services plan.

Mr Bromhead has said "since the first commitment for a public hospital in Forster-Tuncurry was made on 15th February 2019 (in a media release from Minister Hazzard's office) every time progression for the hospital has been promised, it has been delivered.

"The clinical services plan provides an overall analysis of the needs for our region, not just for one medical facility in our region." Mr Bromhead said.

"In August 2019 I received a letter from Hunter New England Local Health District's Chief Executive, Michael DiRienzo stating: 'comprehensive clinical services planning is now required to determine what additional acute services are now required in the whole Manning and Myall Lakes region, including in Forster-Tuncurry.'

"Further to this, I received a letter from The Hon. Brad Hazzard MP, dated $20^{\rm th}$ August 2019 stating:

'planning for a hospital at Forster-Tuncurry will be included as part of clinical service planning for the entire Lower Mid North Coast [Health District]'."

Mr Bromhead said "The recently completed clinical services plan was an assessment of the entire region, including Manning Base Hospital in addition to needs elsewhere in the district, not least a public hospital in Forster-Tuncurry.

public hospital in Forster-Tuncurry.
"Correspondence dated 12th February 2021 from Hunter New England Health states in relation to Forster-Tuncurry:

'The procurement of the consultant required to undertake the options analysis for land purchase etc. is being managed by Health Infrastructure and this will go out for tender in February with engagement by March.'

"It was announced in February 2021 that a consultant would be appointed to assess and make recommendations to the NSW Government on the various location options for the facility.

"This appointment was made in April this year after more than 10,000 people helped me in the fight for a hospital this side of the highway by signing the petition.

"I, like you look forward to the recommendations and a decision as to which of the options the government will proceed with.

"Don't be misled – I am focusing my effort in getting a public hospital in Forster-Tuncurry but building a hospital cannot be done overnight. With each planning stage, we are a step closer" Mr Bromhead said.
