ANZAC DAY AT NABIAC, 2022

After all the rain we've had over the last month or so it was very pleasing to arrive at the Memorial Park in the gloom but be aware the sky above was showing stars. Was a bit disappointed to note that several early arrivals had parked their rather large 4X4 vehicles parallel to the curb so taking up two or three parking spaces each denying many others a closer park. Some mothers do have 'em!


The Nabiac School children – under the direction of Mrs McKinnon – again acquitted themselves well and the service moved smoothly from start to finish. Several people were asked how many folk they thought were present and the general consensus seemed to be the biggest gathering ever for a Dawn Service. Some thought 150+ while some thought at least 200!

Mr Weller again gave an interesting address telling us of the World War One service of Private George Allen from here in Nabiac. I checked and he's named near the top of the first panel. He'd enlisted in late 1916, was in England in early 1917 and later that year was in France. He wasn't long at the front though as he suffered a bout of appendicitis in late 1917. He finally had an operation but was returned to Australia in mid 1918.

The DONK Club members arranged and prepared the BBQ breakfast and coffee and we really are grateful for those business houses in Nabiac who provided the makings: Glen at The Nabiac Butchery; Sonny at FoodWorks; and Jo-Ann at The Old Bank Centre.

The weather held off for the morning ANZAC Day service and the march down from the school was under the direction Tim Wright with a large contingent of school children leading the parade. Rev Quinn conducted the service and MidCoast Council member, Councillor Bell, gave an interesting address.

All in all it was a great day and Nabiac should be quite proud of their turnout at both services. And just to add the icing, though rain threatened but didn't fall until mid afternoon.

Have you noticed our latest initiative on the shelves? Not only can




members recommend a great read with a bookmark from the front desk. Now, members and staff can recommend any book


Incorporation offers some protection for office holders from any debts or liabilities incurred by the group, as long as the Association doesn't make a profit for its members.



We are so very grateful for having held our wedding in a small rural area in which I grew up in and at a beautiful hall that's soaked up all the memories since it was first built in 1926!"




The Garden Crew did a great job getting the grass mown, shrubbery trimmed and general clean up for both the Wedding and also for ANZAC Day; thank you all.





DAWN SERVICE



The Mid Coast Community quilters achieved a bit that day. We welcome *Angela* to our group and we also received donations of fabric and Doona covers (they are great for quilt backings)

IN the month or so since the show we have distributed lots and lots of quilts.

12 quilts to the Palliative care ward of the Taree Hospital

20 quilts to Carries Place, a women's refuge in Maitland

30 quilts, including 10 from the Gloucester Patchworkers, went on a Truck with stockfeed to Coraki and Woodburn

50 plus quilts and 2 bags of Trauma teddies are on their way to Lismore as I write this

30 quilts to a women's refuge in Sydney

So our shelves of completed quilts are severely depleted, but our members are keen and full of ideas of future quilts we want to make.

We also have some donated quilt tops which await quilting.

If our completed quilts are low, our fabric cupboards aren't.!!

We have received many extremely generous donations of beautiful quilting fabrics, there were lots of "ooos" an "ahs" as we sorted and folded them.

Kindness in another's trouble, Courage in your own"


Member Pam will be supplying May's thought.

Nabiac Landcare

Last month's hunt for a mature African Olive continues—
I've had one possible sighting but that was a false alarm.
The tree in question was a cherry guava, another common garden escapee. Since the owner didn't eat the fruit he removed the tree.
Remember uncared for exotic fruit trees often harbour pests like fruit fly that attack the fruit you want to grow.

At the moment we're on the lookout for Golden Raintree/ Chinese

Raintree (Koelreutia elegans subsp formosana) seedlings. I've mentioned this small tree before as a plant of concern on the Bullock Wharf reserve and after pulling close to 100 seedlings recently, it time to consider removing it from your garden, especially if you live close to bushland. Koelreutia was popular with landscapers and councils as a small, tough, attractive tree for smaller yards, in car parks and under powerlines. But....as one gardener put it '....their offspring can start a battle that can last for decades. They have a lovely floral show, but the price in headaches is not worth it.'



What makes this plant so attractive? It's tough and drought tolerant. npound leaves, often turning yellow in

Has glossy compound leaves, often turning yellow in the autumn.

Nice big bunches of yellow flowers that then develop into pretty pink
papery capsules.

No serious pests.

What they didn't tell you is that it sets thousands of seeds and under good conditions can be flowering in three years from seed. That is the description of a plant that has the potential to become an

invader that can degrade Australian ecosystems! Pull it when young and if you have a big one consult <u>NSW WeedWise</u> for chemical control methods.

We do have one native that is similar looking when small. Foam bark (Jagera pseudor) is a rain forest plant. The key feature that distinguishes it from koelreutia is that the young leaves and stems are hairy.

If you read this before May 4th, consider joining Nabiac Landcare on a walk through the bush with *Isabelle Strachen* who is MidCoast 2 Tops Private Land Conservation officer and *Anthony Marchment*, MidCoast Council Natural Assets officer. RSVP to Joel Dunn at joel.kgl.landcare@gmail.com

GETTING IT DONE for Lyne

TOWN CREEK REVIVAL FOR NABIAC



Federal Government funding of \$250,000 will reduce the flood risk for Nabiac's town centre, restore Town Creek, deliver a new public picnic area for the town and shade sails in Memorial Park.

The funding will see the planting of native species of trees along a 125-metre section of Town Creek north of Clarkson Street, the removal of invasive vegetation and construction of a rock-lined low-flow channel to reduce flood impact.

I joined MidCoast Council representatives in town to see plans for the upgrades.

We are prioritising work to mitigate flooding in local communities to avoid the devastation we have seen elsewhere and have experienced in our own region in recent years.

At the same time, this project will improve the charm of Nabiac's village by beautifying the banks of Town Creek, installing a new picnic area on the southern side of Clarkson Street and some long awaited shade sails over the children's playground in Memorial Park.

The work is expected to take about 12 weeks to complete, finishing up at the end of June 2022.



The Wallamba Watershed's History — Another in a series of historical articles gleaned from the archives of the "Manning River Times, 1946 by Bob Mann

FEBRUARY, 1946: FIREFLY TRAGEDY: INQUEST OPENED AND ADJOINED. On Saturday Mr R.S. Hawkins, the district coroner, opened and adjoined an inquest into the cause of death of Albert Dudley of Alexandria near Sydney. Sgts Banslie (?) and Fitzgerald assisted the coroner. Mrs Jean Catherine Dudley gave evidence that the deceased was her husband and licensee of Camellia Grove Hotel at Alexandria. She last saw him alive on November 14th when he left home with Mr J.N. Lucas to spend a short holiday at Tuncurry. They left in a utility. John Normington Lucas (Hotel Manager) of Alexandria said that he and Dudley left Sydney together in the truck. Dudley had driven the truck from Gosford to Tuncurry, although he was not a competent driver he had driven motor vehicles previously but had not done so since his return from New Guinea in 1941. They had camped on Tuncurry Reserve. Dudley never drank intoxicants. On November 21st they left Tuncurry, Dudley driving. They called at a shop in Krambach and had an orange drink and asked to be told the best place for shooting rabbits. The shopkeeper advised them to go to Tipperary and described the route through Firefly. Dudley drove the truck along the Firefly road. When approaching at a speed of between 20 and 30 miles an hour the truck skidded when halfway around a turn. Dudley lost his nerve and the truck went over the side of ta culvert and into the water. Witness was hurled out of the truck on to some stones as it somersaulted. He saw Dudley half underneath the water with his head on some stones. Witness dragged him to the bank and on feeling his wrist could notice no pulsation. The lower part of his body had been beneath the truck. Witness ran to a house and asked the people there to phone for a doctor and an ambulance. He returned with two other men to Dudley, took out the seat from the truck and placed Dudley on it. He was wrapped up to the hip to keep him warm until the Doctor arrived. Doctor F.O Stokes described the injuries to Dudley. He attributed death to a severe crushing of the chest. At that stage the inquiry was adjourned until a date to be fixed. The body was

Nabiac: A Serious Drift From the Lands: Since 1938, every boy, except one, who passed the Intermediate Certificate at School in the Nabiac area had left the district, declared Mr W. Dobell of the Wallamba at the annual conference of the Junior Farmers Clubs council. He was stressing the need for a scheme of agricultural education of country children and the settlement of Junior Farmers on the land to prevent the drift of children to the cities. Avenues were not opened for an agricultural future therefore the bright boy left the land to find a future in the city, he said One delegate blamed the lack of finance a factor in the drift to the city. M.P. E. Breakwell, the retiring State organiser, said that Agricultural and Regional Committeemen should be asked to consider the interest of Junior Farmers in connection with land settlement conference should appoint sub committees to investigate and report to the Minister for Education on rural Education and to enquire into a scheme for land settlement of Junior Farmers. Delegates agreed to the change in the constitution of the club providing that Junior Farmers who turn 21 years of age while a project or division of a project is in progress may continue as a member for a period not exceeding 9 months to allow him to finish the project and to compete in any competition related to it.

Appreciation at the work of the Rural Bank in regard to the filming of Junior Farmer activities. Collaboration of the Rural Bank and the Education Department was of the utmost importance to the club it was stated.

<u>TIPPERARY - MARCH, 1946: TEACHER FOR TIPPERARY:</u> The Minister for Education, Mr *Hefron*, told a deputation that a teacher wold be sent to Tipperary School as soon as the furniture had been installed in the school.





Rugging For the Seasonal Change

As the daylight hours begin to shorten and the temperature begins to dip horses will naturally begin to grow their winter coat. Horses begin to grow a winter coat as a biological reaction to the daylight hours shortening. Therefore, by the time autumn arrives your horse has already started growing his winter coat.

Horses' winter coats are incredibly effective at keeping them warm and for some owners keeping their horse "naked" with a healthy winter coat is their preference. There are, however, other contributing factors that may mean rugging your horse is the best choice for your situation.

Reasons to rug include keeping the horse's coat shorter as a personal preference, usually for riding and competition maintenance. Often owners will rug to help reduce feed costs during the cold months, as horses burn more energy in winter keeping warm. Environmental factors, such as wind and rain can increase the likelihood of a horse feeling the cold and needing a rug. A horse's age and health status are also reasons why an owner may choose to rug. Generally, foals, older horses and horses light on condition are less able to regulate their body temperature and can feel the cold more easily.

Rugging for a short/shiny coat

Many horse owners prefer the aesthetic of a short, shiny coat all year long. Rugging horses will help keep the coat shorter, however this won't completely prevent horses from growing a winter coat. To keep the coat short some owners opt to stable their horse under lights or clip their coat. When using either of these methods, it is important to provide your horse with adequate rugs to prevent them feeling the cold with an unnaturally short coat during the winter months. Our suggestions would be to use a winter rug with polyfill, or layer your

rugs, for example use lighter under rugs with a raincoat over the top.

Rugging to maintain condition and save on feeding

In general, during winter horses will require more feeding, firstly because grass supplies tend to decrease, secondly because horses use more energy



staying warm. In order to not only keep your horse's condition up but save money on feed, rugging is a great option. Even a light rain sheet can keep your horse warmer, so they're not using stored energy to heat themselves.

Rugging to combat the elements

Environmental factors are the top reasons for rugging in the colder months. Horses are usually able to keep themselves adequately warm when left unrugged, however when they experience heavy rainfall that soaks their coat completely through, or there's a strong wind chill factor their ability to regulate their body temperature changes. In still conditions horses can more easily regulate their body temperature than when they experience extreme weather conditions. When heavy rainfall or cold blasts occur, these are the times your horse would appreciate extra rugging to keep their internal temperature ideal.

Rugging based on age and health

Foals, older horses and horses in poorer condition tend to feel the cold more, as it is more difficult for them to regulate their body temperature. For these horses a rug with fill will be beneficial over winter. For foals you can purchase special foal rugs or opt for a mini/ pony size rug.

Takeaway message on rugging

When it comes to rugging it's best to think about what will benefit your horse's needs the most and what you're able to manage time wise (with some rugs these will have to be taken off in the morning and put on in the evening). Over rugging can be more harmful than under rugging or not rugging, therefore if you're unsure about what rug is best for you horse get in touch with the team at Mustang & Co, we can help you devise a rugging plan for your horse.



Lyn's Larder

Going by the last few days, I feel winter warmers are called for.

ONE POT MOROCCAN LAMB

INGREDIENTS

2 tbsp Canola Oil 1 Onion, diced 500 g Trimmed Diced Lamb 2 tsp Moroccan Seasoning

1 tbsp Plain Flour 1½ cups Beef Stock 1 Piece Lemon Rind ½ cup Raisins

420 g tin Red Kidney Beans, drained

410 g tin Baby Carrots (or cooked julienned carrots)

½ cup Water

1/4 cup Chopped Parsley

METHOD

- Heat 1 tablespoon of oil in a large, deep frying pan over high heat. Add lamb and cook for 2 minute or until browned (hint, make sure the meat is DRY so that it sears quickly) on the outside. Remove from the heat
- Add remaining oil to the pan and reduce heat to medium. Cook onion and Moroccan Seasoning for 1-2 minutes. Add the flour and cook 1 minute further.
- Stir in stock, lemon rind, raisins and beans.
 Cook uncovered for 5-10 minutes or until the sauce has thickened slightly
- Remove lemon rind, add carrots and water and return cooked lamb to pan. Cook for 2 minutes or until heated through.
- 5. Remove from heat and stir through the parsley.

Serve with rice or chunky buttered bread.

Welcome to Deb's Gardening,

With a moment of dry weather it didn't take me long to get the garden in order, the grass mowed, whipper snipping done and weeds under control, the garden looks like someone cares for it. I was starting to feel over whelmed as the garden did look an eye sore and there were so much work to do as I wandered around. I couldn't get to it because of the wet weather but like I said it didn't take long to get it back to being under control. Why did I worry so...

I have lost a few plants to the wet weather, bound to happen. I lost some of my lavender, rosemary and a few daisy plants as they didn't like the constant wet feet. They have been cut out and dug up and added to the compost heap.

The vegie garden is starting to get planted out. Peas, beetroot, carrots, turnips are just starting to germinate. The onions are in and the broccoli, cauliflower and cabbage seeds have germinated and been potted up ready to plant. I just need another dry period to get them into the bed that they are going into as I ran out of time before the rains fell again to prepare the bed.

It's time to plant the bulbs and get them into the ground in my deciduous tree patch. I do have to prepare the soil first and get rid of the weeds but it is time to get them in for a lovely spring display.

I am big on houseplants; I am starting to get a good selection of houseplants. Apart from the regular watering, once a month I get a big bucket of water add 50mls of Seasol and pop the plant into the bucket and let it soak until the bubbles stop. Then let drain, the plants love this. I have also potted up some of the plants as they were showing signs of pot bound, time to re-pot them up with a good potting mix into a bigger pot.

Plants can often show the same symptoms for over – or –under watering (limp, yellowing leaves) so you can always rely on them to tell you; simply insert your index finger to the second knuckle into the potting mix. If it is dry, water, but if it's moist you can leave watering for a few days. As a general rule, water once every week (until water runs out of the drainage holes) but extend this to 7-10 days during



Daily Bread

Bread is an important food and you probably eat it every day. The unprocessed bread of yesteryear was nutritious, often home cooked and played a big part in diets ... it truly was the 'staff of life'. Not sure if the same can be said of it's modern counterpart although there are many varieties of tasty bread to choose from.

The bible mentions bread many times. In the Old Testament manna was a type of bread which literally came down from heaven ... given by God to the Israelites in the wilderness, *Exodus 16:4*. 
