## **Nabiac Landcare**

Wow, what a difference two weeks and 225+mm rain make on my stretch of creek! We've got mud for the first time since last April and the creeks are running nicely. Unfortunately the leeches have woken up and the mossies are vicious! (If you've gone outside lately, I probably don't need to tell you this.)

We've been seeing lots of different fungi as we work at Lilypilly Bend. Many of them are quite beautiful. If you like fungi, put on a pair of sturdy shoes and plenty of mozzie repellent an have a walk especially off track.

Some of our members set up a display at the Midcoast Native Bee Day at the Memorial Park. We gave away some bee friendly plants supplied by our members and the Midcoast Council nursery and enjoyed speaking with the people who took an interest in our local group. One of our members even took the opportunity to make

a bee hotel with the assistance of some of the 'bee guys'.

A little more about the giant bird of paradise (Stretlitzia nicolai). It has become quite a serious environmental weed in areas north of here and there is no reason to think it will not become a problem here. If you want to continue to grow the giant bird of paradise, <u>please prune flowers as soon as flowering is finished to prevent seed set.</u> My everpatient husband took his sharpest machete to my plant...I think he almost enjoyed the exercise!

This year will be the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Nabiac Landcare. None of the original members are currently working with the group but we would like to make contact and learn a little more about our history. So, if you were involved with the establishment of Nabiac Landcare and it's first project at Bullock Wharf, please give me a call.

The professional bush regenerators who were working with us earlier this year began some attempts to control the spread of the ornamental black taro/elephant ear growing in Woosters Creek. Unfortunately this is not an edible form of taro. Large patches of taro can slow the natural flow of water in the creek and possibly increase the risk of short term flooding.

Nabiac Landcare normally works each Wednesday (weather permitting) 8-9am to 11am, followed by a very yummy morning tea. Membership is only \$2.00 plus an occasional donation to the morning tea fund and new members are always welcome. Training, tools and safety gear are supplied by Midcoast Council. Give us a ring if you are interested.

Remember, even if you can't help in the bush, you can do your bit for



our lovely area by removing weeds from your own backyard and removing fruit and seeds from exotic plants that the birds and wind will spread. Most of all enjoy a walk in the local bush!

### Historic book launch

There is a very limited print run, so history buffs and those who want to know how Nabiac ended up at its current location, this book will answer many questions. The cost of the book is \$30.

History is the platform upon which today's amenities and lifestyle are constructed. Therefore, books such as this, give us a chance to look back and appreciate just how far we have travelled.

The Neighbourhood Centre, through funds raised by the OP Shop, has financially supported this publication. All proceeds from its sale will be returned to the Neighbourhood Centre to support other worthwhile community projects.

## **MINIMBAH MATTERS**



Minimbah Rural Fire Brigade is very excited

because we are getting an MDT fitted to our fire truck this month.

"So, what's the big deal" we hear you ask. Well ......

During those horrible fires in the 2019-2020 summer, communications were stretched to, and sometimes beyond, their limit. One of the lessons that was learnt and reinforced during those fires, was that timely, efficient, accurate and clear communications is always vital, never more so than during emergencies such as those experienced at that time.

Possible shortcomings with the communications were noted and acted upon by the NSW Rural Fire Service (RFS), and as a result Mobile Data Terminals (MDTs) are being fitted to all RFS fire trucks and operational vehicles. March is the month for the Mid Coast Rollout.

A Mobile Data Terminal is, in appearance, much like a Tablet or an iPad. It will be wired into the vehicle and will help to deliver up to date information to firefighters when they are travelling to, and are on scene at fires and other incidents.

GPS locations, current and forecast weather conditions together with the effect they will have on the fire behaviour, and much more, are the kind of valuable advance information that this two-way system caters for. It's a whiz bang piece of gear!!

Regular situation reports (sitreps) will be transmitted by crews on the fire-grounds to an incident centre, using the MDT. The details will be examined, noted, mapped, then predictions and decisions regarding suppressing the fire, are made. As a result of the extensive details obtained, additional land and air support, or Hazmat crews, may be required as a matter of urgency. These can be arranged and the information passed to those on the fire ground, using the MDT. This information is then available to all other crews who are involved so they know what to expect and when to expect it. The majority of these communications would previously have been by radio. That caused an extremely "cluttered" radio network in the height of an emergency, which was far from ideal. Some "decluttering" has already been implemented as reporting changes were introduced, and the MDTs are the icing on the communications cake.

It is a "big picture" situational awareness that will help fire fighters reduce the spread and severity of bushfires more efficiently and effectively, and thereby reducing loss of life and property.

We can never have too many active fire fighters. You can contact us on the above email address and mobile phone number. Volunteering with the RFS can, and often does, lead to a career within the organisation.

## **Fire Permits**

Yes, you do still require a fire permit. You can obtain the contact details of your local Fire Permit Officer by calling **NSW RFS Mid Coast Fire Control Centre on 1300 643 262**.

If the Fire Danger Rating is High or above, existing permits will be suspended, and no permits will be issued until conditions improve. During the Bush Fire Danger Period, the

Mid Coast Area Fire Danger Ratings (Fire Risk)
are published on Facebook whenever they change.

## **Nabiac Village Futures Group**



The Village Futures Group has just finalized the 2024 – 2029, Nabiac Community Strategic Plan.

The original Community Strategic Plan was first developed in November 2004 and dealt with major issues such as the proposed highway bypass and the ongoing drive for a swimming pool.

This current Plan will be presented to the MidCoast Councillors at one of their regular meetings. The Plan aligns with the MidCoast Council's 2030 plan, but with a particular focus on Nabiac.

### Successful projects

A number of projects and priorities that were identified in the previous plan, have been undertaken and completed during the previous 5 years. These include:

- Dump point for recreational vehicles installed.
- EV charger installed.
- Road Safety improvements at Dibbs Street (stop sign) and changes to Failford intersection with M1. Sealing and drainage at Memorial Park and removal of old fence in roadway at the school. A 40 zone around the shopping area has approval but has not yet been implemented.
- Memorial Park a new fence, removal of old play equipment, new War Memorial signage.
- New children's play area with little kid's bike track, BBQs tables and seating.
- Swimming pool installed solar heating and security cameras.
- · Planting of new trees around the Oval.
- Town Creek removal of weeds, lining of creek bed with rocks and planting of native plants; installation of picnic tables and seating.
- Aub Ferris Complex amenities block with canteen facilities, meeting room and undercover space; equipment sheds for MCC, Rugby and Soccer Clubs; and a water station.

It should be prominently acknowledged, that the funding for many of the projects, were donated by the Neighbourhood Centre using money raised by the volunteers at the Op Shop.

This new plan details our vision for tomorrow and beyond through priority actions based around the four heading below.


STRATEGY 1 Protect and enhance our village charm (family friendly rural village)



## Lyn's Larder

## **HONEY & LEMON SIMMERED LAMB WITH COUSCOUS**

## INGREDIENTS LAMB

1.2kg Easy carve Leg of Lamb

1/2 cup Plain flour

1/3 cup Olive Oil Onion, white, chopped Dried Chilli flakes 1/4 tsp 2 cloves Garlic, thinly sliced

1 tsp Allspice **Ground Cumin** 1 tsp **Ground Ginger** 1 tsp Ground Coriander 1 tsp

1 tsp Turmeric

2 tsp freshly ground Black Pepper

Vegetable stock 1 cup

2/3 cup Honey

2 Cinnamon sticks 2 Lemons 6 whole Cloves 8-10 **Dried Figs** 

METHOD

Preheat oven to 180°C. Trim fat and sinew from lamb and cut into 4cm cubes. Put flour and lamb into a plastic bag, twist top and

shake until lamb is covered with flour.

- Heat half the oil in a large heavy based pan. Add half the lamb and cook until all sides are golden brown. Remove lamb and set aside. Repeat with remaining oil and lamb. Put all the lamb into a deep, round casserole dish.
- Discard all but 2 teaspoons of oil from the pan and add onion and garlic, then cook for 2-3 minutes over a low heat. Add chilli, allspice, cumin, ginger, coriander, turmeric and pepper. Stir, then cook for about 1 minute.
- Stir in the stock and honey, add cinnamon sticks and simmer for 5 minutes. Shred the zest of one lemon, then cut lemon in half. Juice half the lemon and add juice to the pan. Stud the other lemon half with cloves and add to the lamb dish. Cut second lemon into thin slices and add to lamb. Pour stock mixture over lamb, cover then cook for 15 minutes.
- Serve with the Couscous

## **INGREDIENTS FOR COUSCOUS**

Olive oil 1 tbsp

1 cup Instant Couscous 11/4 cups Vegetable Stock

Bunch Coriander roughly chopped

## **METHOD FOR COUSCOUS**

Heat oil in a medium heavy based pan. Add couscous, then stir for a minute. Add stock, bring to the boil and cook for 2 minutes, stirring with a fork. Remove from heat, cover for 5 minutes, add coriander, then stir.

## Welcome to Deb's Gardening,

The joys of renovating - I now have the internet back on and my computer set up in a little corner of a make shift lounge room. So I am able to get back to Debs Gardening. I know it has been a while since my last edition but it's good to be back typing away. The kitchen, bathroom and toilet are all outside so I am constantly living with mud and dirt everywhere. I am not complaining as our builder informed me *No mess, No progress*. I guess this will be my life for the next 6 months until the renovation is complete. My only grime is the fact that the builders love to put material right along the borders of my gardens and a lot of it is heavy timber, steel and just rubbish that I can't lift by myself to move and tidy up, so it is left for the long grass to grow through and around it. Something that I have to work hard at ignoring.

This season has been hot and humid and the vegie garden has had a few failures but a lot of successes and considering not a lot of time has been spent in the vegetable garden, as the reno and having the grand-kiddies over the summer holidays took up a lot of my time, I have still been able to put a lot of vegetables and salad on the make shift table.

One important task I have been keeping up is the composting and mulching, as it is an important resource for the garden and what keeps the garden growing and soil healthy. Healthy soil, healthy plants. So I would like to touch base with the fertility of the soil.

The fertility of the soil is an organic gardener's preoccupation and its enrichment, without the use of chemical fertilisers, a constant task. The best all round fertiliser is compost, which contains so much valuable organic matter. So it is important to make as wide a mix as possible of material which contain as many as possible of the elements soil needs for maximum health. A cake can only be as good as the ingredients.

It is important also to keep the correct acid/alkaline balance of the soil as shortages of calcium, copper, zinc and molybdenum show up on acid soil and shortages of iron, manganese and boron on alkaline soils.

### The Nutrients plants need to find in soil-

**Nitrogen** is necessary for leaf growth. Nitrogen is a major component of chlorophyll, so without an adequate supply of it the complicated process can all break down.

Green leaves and stems, seaweed, hay, fowl manure, feathers, urine, blood and bone meal, grass clippings are all rich in Nitrogen. Signs of deficiency - The plants are week and stunted; leaves limp and yellow.

**Phosphorus** does not leach out of the soil but if the soil is too acid or alkaline it keeps the phosphorus insoluble and so quite useless as plant food. To help release it, add compost to the soil, correct the pH balance and keep up a good mulch so that there are plenty of soil organisms at work. Ground phosphorus rock scattered over the soil will help.

Blood and bone meal, chook, pigeon and pig manure, Egg shells, ground phosphate rock are all rich in phosphorus.

Signs of deficiency – Poor root development with stunted growth and bad-looking leaves

**Potassium** supply must be steady as it is needed to help plants to digest food, and it leaches away easily. If the soil is to acid it becomes

insoluble and of no food value.

Seaweed, wood ash, green leaves and twigs, animal manure and bone meal are all good sources of supple. Permanganate of potash, chamomile, nettle, dandelion all contain some too.

Signs of deficiency - Weak stems. Limp leaves

Calcium is needed to build strong cell walls

Lime, dolomite, wood ash, chives, chamomile, dandelion, nettle and comphrey all contain calcium

Signs of deficiency —Tips of new shoots wilt, leaves curl and become discoloured. The soil is too acid.

**Magnesium** is needed to keep up the supply of chlorophyll. It is found in dolomite, Epsom salts, dandelion and parsley. Signs of deficiency —Older leave turn yellow and fall.

**Sulphur** is needed for the formation of chlorophyll It is found in nettles and other organic matter.

Signs of deficiency – Stunted yellow leaves, Trace elements needed

**Manganese** is for the formation of proteins and chlorophyll. It is found in compost, wood ash, saw dust, horse manure, permanganate of potash and dandelion.

Signs of deficiency – Young leaves turn yellow Copper and Zinc needed as enzyme activators

Copper is found nettles and yarrow. Zinc is found in corn stalks Signs of deficiency – Leaves become mottled and yellow. The deficiency occurs most frequently in acid and sandy soils.

**Boron** is needed to regulate the plants use of nitrogen It is found in horse manure, sawdust, compost and wood ash. Signs of deficiency – Stems become yellow and break, buds rot. Citrus fruit becomes brown and soggy in the centre. The deficiency occurs most frequently when soil is alkaline.

**Molybdenum** is needed to prevent growth deformities It is found in horse manure, sawdust, compost, wood ash and corn stalks.

Signs of deficiency – New growth is distorted "whiptail "in brassicas is a sure sign.

When I was starting out, I learnt all this go to information to help me understand the elements for what is needed to build up soil health. The mistake that has been made in the past has been to think of the plant as requiring food and assiduously feeding what we thought was needed while completely neglecting the needs of the soil; it's a case of first things first: feed the soil, for the plant will get what it needs in the form that it likes and can easily digest.

There can be no life without soil and no soil without life.

Well it's time to get back to my new role as Tradies Assistant. Until next time

## DYERS CROSSIG LANDCARE GROUP

The Dyers Crossing Landcare Group met for the first time in five years on 5th February in Firefly. It was an inspiring meeting, with plenty of ideas to spark future events.

New and Old members connected over shared landholder issues. DCLG founder, Les Roberts also came along and offered much wisdom.



It was encouraging to receive messages from people who couldn't make this catch-up but are keen to come along to future events.

The theme "Successes and Mistakes" shaped the meeting. We have a wide range of knowledge and skills amongst us, including natural weed management, regenerative agriculture, reforestation expertise; beef farming; vegetable farming, so we had plenty of info to share.

## We discussed:

- Giant Parramatta Grass & crown rot fungus
- Mulching & slashing; pros and cons
- Keeping moisture and nutrients on our land
- Implications of zoning changes in our area, which may result in land division.
- The changing shape of farming and land management with the increase in smaller land size and increase in horses.
- Resources available through Landcare Membership

### Successes included:

- Doubling numbers of cattle head on a beef farm, after implementing strategies from Brian Wehlberg's Holistic Management consulting.
- Using chickens to prepare soil for a garden bed
- Setting up good fencing at the outset
- Using compost tea to improve outputs

### Mistakes included:

- Not managing weeds effectively; allowing too much spread through slashing etc.
- Digging a hole with the auger, into clay soil to plant trees
- Lack of using compost teas to bring life into soil
- Using fertilizer and other inputs, without paying attention to soil health; and encouraging biology.

### **Recommendations included:**

- The Holistic Management course, coming soon to Krambach
- Permaculture course with Brett Cooper at Limestone Permaculture
- Future guest speakers: Biological inputs.

The next gathering is at Dyers Crossing on 25th March. Address TBA closer to the date. The main topic will be looking at the range of grasses on this property, setaria and pasture improvement. The property owner is excited about their upcoming consultation with an agronomist, and we'll be discussing recommendations from the agronomist at this meeting.

Also coming up will be a visit to a 2000 acre beef farm in Krambach, to learn about the success of managing the land holistically. Date TBA soon.


We have just spread crown rot fungus at our place, so we'll keep you posted with the progress of managing the Giant Parramatta Grass.


