CONDITIONS OF ENTRY TO SHOWGROUND

Nabiac Showgrounds is a designated **glass free** area, so no glass drink containers are to be brought onto the Nabiac Showgrounds.

The Wallamba District A & H Assoc. Inc. reserves the right to search for any prohibited item including, but not limited to, weapons, controlled, dangerous or illegal substances, alcohol (bottles or cans) which are expressly forbidden and subject to confiscation.

No alcohol is to be carried or consumed in the sideshow area. Alcohol must only be consumed in the designated licence area. Drunken, unruly offensive behaviour or fighting will result in immediate removal from the showground.

The speed limit for all vehicles within the showground area is 5 kilometres per hour which is walking speed.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ALL EXHIBITORS

Any exhibitor intending to bring electrical equipment to the showground will be required to ensure all electric leads, tools, and appliances have been inspected and tagged by a licensed electrical contractor. This is a requirement of The Occupational Health and Safety act 1983.


