## Nabiac Landcare

Ah, March, mud, mossies and humidity! We did manage to put some time in the local reserves during the month doing another Crofton weed blitz and the team came out looking like their mums need OMO.



The colour to watch for in April is still YELLOW. I know those bursts of yellow along the road are pretty but....if you stop and think....how much has cassia (*Senna pendula var glabrata*) spread is the past five years, especially in Nabiac. We're currently playing spot the yellow in our reserves hoping to pick up plants we've missed.



A slightly different yellow is also showing up in gardens locally. The Chinese rain tree, Golden rain tree (*Koelreuteria elegans supsp formosana*) is also blooming. We've pulled a lot of its seedlings in the Bullock Wharf reserve and it's only a matter of time until it become a problem in the local bush as it has further north. If you have a dog that likes to eat things in the garden be warned, the seeds are toxic to dogs.

Why worry??? Environmental weeds displace native species in our bush areas. Our native plants, animals, bugs, and fungi depend on each other to flourish. Most of the environmental weeds of concern have few pests and diseases in Australia so they do a slow and insidious take-over.

Which weeds to control in April? Just about every problem weed! So pick your weed, check out control methods recommended on the NSWweedwise website or app and do your bit for your local environment.

How do you know it's a weed? Take a good photo, preferably close-up of as many distinctive plant features as you can. Try Google Lens...don't just look at Google's first choice because Google is often wrong and then do an a double check on the ID using Australian sources. Check with your local council weed officers or Landcare teams. I usually don't suggest going to formal botanical keys because the features they identify by are often quite complex and the language used is outside of most of our vocabularies.

Remember, even if you can't help in the bush, you can do your bit for

This date has been the planned date for a few years now, so it is pure coincidence that just after we have had 5-6 inches of rain, the need for Permits is lifted. It's all about the timing.

Weather conditions change at the drop of a hat, but some things are set in stone, like mandatory rules regarding lighting of outdoor fires throughout the year. Here is a little whimsical memory jog.

### THERE IS A SAYING IN THE TOWN

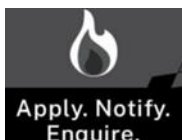
*(Loosely to the tune of There is a Tavern in the Town)*

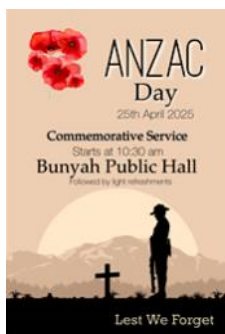

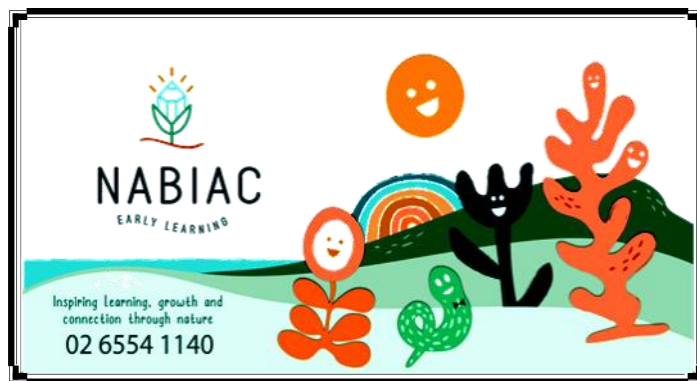

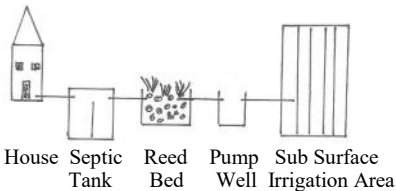

## WALLAMBA LANDCARE GROUP NEWS

We enjoyed a great morning at a beautiful property in Failford last Friday, with 22 members coming along. Our wonderful host provided us with a snapshot of farming Angus cattle on the river flats, along with a tour of their beautiful gardens, had us brimming with inspiration and ideas.

- The veggie patch included a super cute potting shed, raised bed and an array of pickings.
- The chook run is adjacent to the veggie gardens, which means plenty of greens from the veggie beds are thrown over the fence for the chickens. Their lodgings have been created from an old concrete water tank. Very cool!
- The property owner's observations about the relationship between flooding rains and the health of native trees over the years was interesting. A totally different set of issues from most of our properties; their soil is enviably deeper, more nutritious, and easier to dig.
- It was interesting to hear about how some year's heavy rainfall helped to deliver nutrients to the land, whereas the result of other rainy seasons has led to leeching of nutrients, with grasses evidently less bright green after a flooding event.
- We learned about various inputs and activities for their land, which was ex-dairy, such as aerating and adding different plants, such as turnips to introduce different root systems, along with native trees, which play a role in biodiversity, supporting local fauna and flood management.
- Joel Dunn, our local LandCare coordinator, provided insights into tree species and brought along some native tube stock trees to share, which included: Brush Box, Grey Gum, Majenta Lillypilly and Grey Myrtle.
- Les Roberts, our group's founder, came along and provided tips on pasture management.

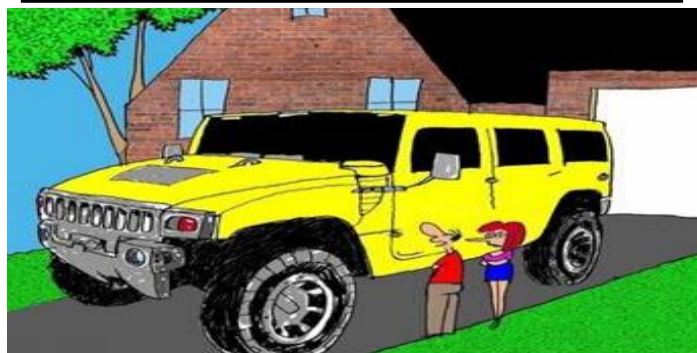

# Lyn's Larder

## ROAST PUMPKIN, SPINACH & FETA SALAD

A light lunch meal

### INGREDIENTS FOR FILLING

600g	Pumpkin (peeled) cut into 3cm cubes
1½ tbsp	Olive oil
	Salt & Pepper
¼ cup	Pine nuts
150g	Baby spinach leaves (4 handfuls)
60g	Feta cheese, crumbled (or more if preferred)
2½ tbsp	Extra virgin olive oil
2 tbsp	Balsamic vinegar
1 tsp	Honey
	Salt & Pepper

### METHOD

#### Pumpkin

Preheat oven to 220°C (430°F)

Toss Pumpkin with 1½ tbsp olive oil, salt & pepper. Spread onto a baking tray and bake for 20 minutes.

Remove from oven and flip over and bake a further 7-10 minutes until golden but not mushy. (let cool if serving salad cold)

#### Dressing

Shake the virgin olive oil, balsamic vinegar, honey & salt and pepper in a jar to mix.

Toast the pine nuts in a dry skillet over a medium heat until lightly golden and smelling nutty then immediately remove from skillet.

Place spinach into a salad bowl, drizzle with a bit of the dressing and toss.

Add pumpkin, just a bit of the feta and pine nuts and gently, BRIEFLY toss to spread the feta...

Put onto a serving plate and sprinkle with the remaining feta and pine nuts

Just before serving sprinkle over the remaining dressing.

## MASHED POTATO LIKE YOU HAVE NEVER TASTED

### INGREDIENTS

175kg	Sebago potatoes
1 tbsp	Cooking salt for cooking the potatoes
2/3 cup	Milk
75g	Unsalted butter
½ cup	Sour Cream or Yoghurt - full fat
1 tbs	Cooking salt to taste
1½ cups	Mozzarella Cheese, (tightly packed) freshly shredded
1 cup	Red Leicester or Cheddar Cheese (tightly packed) shredded
200g	Streaky Bacon, chopped
¼ cup	Green onion, finely sliced

### METHOD

Place the bacon into a cold non stick pan over medium heat (no oil). As the pan heats the bacon fat will start to melt, then turn up the heat to medium and stir for 3 minutes until golden. Drain on paper towels.

Peel the potatoes and cut into 3cm cubes. Place in a large pot and cover with water to 10cm over the potatoes. Add 1 tbsp salt, bring to boil and then reduce to simmering rapidly. Cook for 15 minutes until very soft.

Drain well and return to pot. Leave for 1 minute, shaking pot every now and then to encourage evaporation of the water.

Add milk, butter, sour cream and 1 tbsp salt. Mash until smooth - don't use a food processor, blender or beater as it will go gluey.

Preheat oven to 200°C/400°F (180°F),

Spread the potato in a 2 litre baking dish. Smooth the surface.

Sprinkle with the cheeses then the bacon.

Cover loosely with foil and bake for 20 minutes covered. Remove foil and bake a further 10 minutes until the cheses is bubbly and golden Sprinkle with the green onion and serve - stays warm for about 20 minutes.

## MANNING HOSPITAL REDEVELOPMENT MOVES FORWARD

Member for Myall Lakes, Tanya Thompson, has shared that a builder has been appointed for the Stage 2 Redevelopment of Manning Hospital, with the project taking a key step forward.

Following a competitive tender process, AW Edwards has been selected to carry out the enabling works, which are set to begin in the coming weeks.

"Construction timeframes for the main redevelopment will be confirmed once planning is complete," Mrs Thompson said.

The enabling works will involve demolishing the administration building and some surrounding structures, as well as relocating two bulk oxygen tanks.

"These steps will prepare the site for the main construction phase, which will deliver modern clinical spaces and better hospital connectivity.

"Our region has long awaited this redevelopment, and it's crucial our health infrastructure evolves to meet the growing needs of our community," said Mrs Thompson.

Planning and design for the redevelopment are ongoing, with input from hospital staff, stakeholders, and the community helping shape the final plans. Detailed designs will be released later this year for further community feedback.

"I'm very eager to see work begin at Manning Hospital," Mrs Thompson said.

Mrs Thompson confirmed that she will be meeting with Minister for Regional Health, Ryan Park, in the coming weeks to discuss progress on the Lower Mid North Coast Health Service project - Forster Tuncurry Health facility.

"I will continue to update the community as these projects progress," concluded Mrs Thompson.

### Welcome to Deb's Gardening

I have observed that the ants are making mounds in the lawn again, another sign that more rain is coming and it is just starting to rain now. The weather report says rain all week. Lucky I mowed and whipper snipped the other day, and as the moon is in the waning phase I also sowed carrots, radish, beetroots and Swedes. The good thing about it raining all week is the carrots should have a better chance of germinating with the soil being kept moist. My last lot didn't germinate and I think it was because it got hot again and the soil kept drying out between me watering, such a finicky crop! Farmers who grow carrots commercially must have a secret that I don't know about.

I mentioned in my last article about the plague of monolepta beetle that I had; well they have still been a nuisance. They chewed all the leaves off my beetroot, strawberries and rhubarb plants. Rhubarb leaves are poisonous to humans and animals as they have a high content of oxalic acid a natural occurring compound, which can cause various health issues. Rhubarb leaves make a good natural insecticide just by boiling the leaves, cool, strain and it is advised to add soap flakes for better adhesion, then spray the effected plant. Rhubarb leaf spray is effective against sap sucking insect like aphids and caterpillars. I have currently only seen a few monolepta beetles around since they annihilated the rhubarb, maybe eating the leaves did knock them around after all.

There are new leaves emerging from the rhubarb plants so I haven't lost them. As for the strawberries well, they were in need of a good prune back as they were sending out runners, they have been cut back, so they are fine. The beetroot hadn't gotten to the size that I wanted to start picking but I still am able to pick and have baby beets instead. So all in all it wasn't a big loss.

There are a few other natural insecticides that you can make to use in the garden, such as garlic and pepper spray, chilli spray, neem oil spray, vegetable oil and soap spray, though in my garden I have never needed to resort to any sprays. I lied, the only time I resorted to using a spray was when the monolepta beetles blackened my ceiling in my new alfresco area last month and out came the fly spray which



was a plant based fly spray at that. The best management plan in my garden always starts with preventative and other non-chemical methods and that's by diversifying, companion planting, attracting beneficial insects and creatures and keeping the plants healthy with good soil practices.

This morning I had a wonder in the vegetable garden and noticed that the beans are starting to flower (the monolepta beetles didn't seem to like bean leaves), growing next to the beans and throughout the vegetable garden is self sown nasturtiums that continually pop up everywhere. (When I first started my vegetable garden many, many years ago I spread a small packet of nasturtium seeds throughout the garden beds and I haven't had to sow any since, they just keep popping up everywhere). I noticed that some of the nasturtiums leaves are chewed and there are a few caterpillars, the beans are being left alone, happy and healthy. Nasturtiums are a wonderful companion plant for the vegetable garden; caterpillars are attracted to them and leave most of the vegetables alone.

Autumn is the month that I feed the citrus with chicken manure; the fruit are starting to swell. I also make sure that they are mulched and free from grass. Citrus have shallow roots so always a good idea to keep the grass away so the citrus tree doesn't compete for nutrients. I have a big Tahitian lime tree and it continuously keeps me in supply of limes throughout the year, a wonderful citrus tree to plant in any garden. I have also fed the banana plant and cut back the off shoots to 3 stems per plant. Bananas are from the herb family distantly related to ginger, since the plant has a succulent tree stem instead of a wood one. Banana plants are heavy feeders and should be fed monthly and require regular watering.

Autumn is also the time to plant spring flowering plants and bulbs like daffodils and jonquils. I bought an assortment of daffodil and jonquil bulbs in bulk ready to be planted once it stops raining to add to the rest of my bulbs already in the ground, as I want to fill my deciduous garden. Planting bulbs under deciduous trees is the ideal spot as the trees protect the bulbs in the summer heat while they lay dormant. Daffodils thrive in well drained soil, rich with organic matter and since they will be planted in my deciduous garden there is already plenty of

organic matter in the soil from all the fallen leaves that I mow over and let rot down. They will be planted a depth of 10-15cm with the pointy end up.

The sweet peas are in; they say you should plant them after St Patrick's Day, so that is when I planted them and hopefully they will germinate and the birds or mice don't eat them. I have them protected with netting so my fingers are crossed. Sweet peas require a good strong trellis, so I have mine growing on the outside fence of my vegetable garden. Sweet peas make beautiful cut flowers, so the house is filled with sweet peas in spring. I always let a few go to seed and let them die off into the soil and last year I had them germinate all by themselves, I am hoping the same for this year but I haven't seen any yet.

I have always got flowers and foliage to pick to bring inside throughout the year, whether it be grevilleas in the winter, dahlias, zinnias, pineapple lilies and salvias in the summer. I love grabbing my secretaires and bringing the outdoors in. The work I put in now will be for my spring display. There is a break in the rain, time for me to get outdoors.

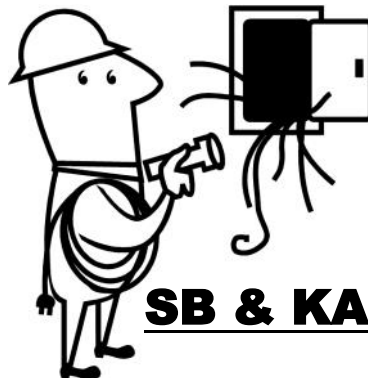
